## Victims

Palestinian refugee Ahmad Mohamed Jawdat Khalil, affiliated with the Palestine Liberation Army (PLA), was pronounced dead on December 10, 2018 as he fought alongside the Syrian government forces in Adra industrial city, in Rif Dimashq.

The casualty was a resident of AlNeirab Camp in Aleppo.

AGPS documented the death of 276 PLA fighters in war-torn Syria.



## Latest Developments

AGPS found out that nine Palestinian refugees died in the Syrian territories in November 2018. Aleppo topped the list with three casualties, followed by Rif Dimashq and AlSuweida with two refugees each. Another Palestinian was pronounced dead in the blockaded Gaza Strip and one more refugee died in Latakia.

In November 2017, four Palestinians died in Damascus, three in Deir AlZor, two in Rif Dimashq, and another in an unknown location.

Meanwhile, Palestinian leaders and the Director-General of the General Authority for Palestinian Arab Refugees Ali Mustafa paid a visit to Damascus Governor Adel Anwar AlAlebi at his office in Damascus.

The delegation discussed latest developments regarding reconstruction endeavors in Yarmouk Camp and the urgent measures needed to allow the displaced residents to return to their homes.

On November 6, Syria's deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs and Expatriates Faysal Miqdad said the government has officially signaled the go-ahead for the return of Palestinian refugees to Yarmouk Camp.

A decision issued by Syria's Council of Ministers during its weekly session, held on November 11, tasked local authorities in Damascus with rehabilitating infrastructure and destroyed facilities in Yarmouk Camp so as to pave the way for the safe return of the displaced residents.

The Syrian government forces regained control over Yarmouk Camp and southern Damascus towns following a 33-day military operation launched in April 2018. Dozens of civilians were killed and dozens more injured in the offensive. Over 80% of buildings have gone either totally or partially destroyed in the warfare.

In the meantime, Palestinian refugees who have been displaced from Damascus and its suburbs to the northern Syrian province of Idlib appealed to UNRWA to take urgent action as regards their tragic situation.

The refugees urged UNRWA to provide them with urgent medical assistance and vital services.

During the last quarter of 2016, dozens of Palestinian families had been deported from their shelters in Khan AlSheih Camp to Idlib, following a reconciliation accord struck between the Syrian government and the opposition outfits. Thousands of others had been deported from the Palestinian refugee camps of Yarmouk, AlSabina, AlHussainiya, and Handarat.

Along the same line, the Commission of Palestinians of Syria for Relief and Development distributed fuel supplies to 348

displaced Palestinian families from Yarmouk and Khan Ehieh refugee camps in Idlib, north of Syria.

The measure makes part of underway endeavors to assuage the crises endured by displaced Palestinian families in tension-stricken Syria.
