Victims

Mr. Nemer Hussein, a member of the Yarmouk Camp Civic Council, was killed yesterday by a sniper shot while he was leaving his house at the Yarmouk Camp, Al Rija square. It is mentioned that Mr. Nemer assassination is not the first one in the camp, since many activists were assassinated by unknown groups.

Meanwhile, Khalid Ibrahim, an officer of the PLA in Khan Dannon Camp, was killed during the ongoing battles in Daraa camp, raising the PLA victims' toll to 106 victims, as documented by the AGPS.

Recent Updates

The UNHCR announced yesterday about the loss of about 200 immigrants, after the boats, that were carrying them towards the Italian shores, sank.

In the same context, some activists confirmed to the AGPS that the Italian Coast Guards rescued about 9 foreign passengers, and the boats were launched from the Libyan shores, while the AGPS could not identify the nationalities of the missing people due to the ongoing rescuing operations.

Meanwhile, the Palestinian and the Syrian refugees in Karmouz prison, who are detained for more than 100 days, are continuing their hunger strike for the third day respectively. Confirming that they will continue the strike until they achieve their demands that are represented with "the



urgent coordination between the concerned parties in order to be received in the EU countries, where their families are.

It is mentioned that the refugees were arrested while trying to reach Italy from Turkey, but they were deceived by the smugglers, who left them in the middle of the road in an island off the Alexandria shores before they were arrested by the Egyptian Coast Guards.

In Syria, the water was cut in Daraa camp for 302 days, and in the Yarmouk camp for 155 days respectively amid the deteriorated humanitarian and living conditions in the two camps, who are suffering from a complete absent of the basic services; such as power, medical services, and water, where the residents resorted to the artesian wells in an attempt to secure some water.

On the other hand, a number of bus drivers in Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb stopped working for fear of being arrest similarly as to their colleagues, where some Syrian Security members arrested them and a number of youth before days.

In Damascus suburb, the Charity Committee for the Relief of Palestinian People distributed a number of food rations to the residents of Khan Dannon camp in Damascus suburb. The distribution included 120 families in the framework of distributing 1200 food rations campaign, that is supervised by the committee. It is mentioned that Khan Dannon camp suffers from a difficult living situations because of the unemployment spread, the high cost of living, and the tensed security situation in its surroundings.

On the other hand, the Syrian security forces released the refugee Moataz Ismael Azzam," from Al Nairab camp, after being arrested for a day. It is mentioned that Al Nairab camp suffers from a state of instability and insecure as a result of the deteriorated security situation in its surroundings.

In Lebanon, the Palestinians of Syria Committee distributed some relief aids yesterday, included: heaters, carpets, and cleaning disinfectants, to a number of Palestinian Syrian families, who were displaced for fear of the ongoing war in Syria.

On a different topic, UNRWA has indicated in a recent published statistics on its website that the numbers of the Palestinian Syrians in Egypt and Lebanon have increased and decreased in Jordan. Meanwhile, the number of the displaced people in Lebanon was raised from "44,000" to "51.3" thousands according to the new statistics. The number of the Palestinian Syrian refugees in Egypt increased from 4,000 to 6,000 refugees, while in Jordan; the UNRWA statistics indicated that the number of the refugees decreased to 10.6 thousand after it was over 15,000 refugees.

In the same context, UNRWA noted, on its website, that there are about 1,100 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Libya, about 1,000 others in the Gaza Strip, and some in Turkey, Malaysia, Thailand, and Indonesia.

Numbers and Statistics till 11/2/2015

- *At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *2645 Palestinian refugee victims were documented by the AGPS.*
- ***The Yarmouk Camp:** - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 585 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 664 days, water was cut for 155 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 165 victims.*
- *80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 14348 refugees in Jordan and 42,000 in Lebanon, according to UNRWA statistics till November.*

- **Al Husayneyya Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **487** days respectively.
- **Al Sbeina Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **456** days respectively.
- **Handarat Camp:** - Residents have left the camp for **658** days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- **Dara'a Camp:** - It is now almost **302** days without water and **70%** of its buildings were demolished.
- **Jermana, AL SaiedaZainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:** - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- **Khan Al Sheih Camp:** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
