Recent Updates in the Yarmouk Camp

UNRWA announced yesterday that Commissioner-General Pierre Krähenbühl is undertaking an urgent mission to Syria today, 11th of April 2015, The visit is prompted by UNRWA's deepening concerns for the safety and protection of some 18,000 Palestinian and Syrian civilians, including 3,500 children, as Yarmouk remains under the control of armed groups, and as civilian lives continue to be threatened by the effects of the armed conflict in the area. The objectives of the Commissioner-General's visit are: to consult with the Government of Syria on its perspectives, and to exchange views on peaceful approaches to addressing the humanitarian consequences of the situation in Yarmouk; to consult with the Deputy UN Special Envoy on approaches to non-state actors in order to secure humanitarian access to civilians. to consult with the Deputy Special Envoy and other UN colleagues on the UN's role with particular reference to feasible humanitarian action to support civilians in Yarmouk under all circumstances

Secretary-General of the United Nations deputy, RamzyEzzedinRamzy, arrived in Damascus to discuss with Syrian government about the humanitarian crisis in Yarmouk.

Meanwhile, conflicting statements issued by members of the PLO between supporters and opponents of military action in the Yarmouk refugee camp continued..

Furthermore, news reported that ISIS intension of withdraw from the Yarmouk camp and deliver its headquarters to Al Nusra Front, however, until the moment there is no confirmed information.

For their part, people of the Yarmouk camp renewed their appeal of entering urgent medical aid to the Yarmouk due to rapidly deteriorating medical situation inside the camp, where dozens of injuries remain untreated ten days ago because of the complete loss of medical supplies from the camp.

On the other hand, solidarity sit-ins with Yarmouk were carried out in German capital Berlin, Hlsnbura, Kalmar, Kristen Swedish city, and the Lebanese town of Mar Elias. The protesters demanded international and Palestinian authorities for urgent action to stop the suffering of the Yarmouk people.

Al Aedein Camp Homs

Syrian security forces arrested three Palestinian refugees from Al Aedein camp in Homs. They are: "Mohammed Mousa Mohammed Shatara," in his thirties, originally from Tarshiha village in Palestine and "Khalid Mousa Mohammed Shatara," in his forties, originally from Safed city in Palestine. They were arrested on 10th of April after raiding and breaking into their homes which are located in Akrima neighborhood east of the camp. Moreover, "Iyad Naim Awad," in his forties, originally



from Al Shajaravillage in Palestine was also arrested by members of a regular army checkpoint on 11.04.2015.

It is worth mentioning that the families of Al Aedein camp in Homs are suffering from raids and arrests campaigns by the Syrian security between now and then, prompting many of them, especially young people to leave the camp and move to towns and adjacent areas, while others migrated to European countries in search of safety and security.

Arrest

The Syrian security services arrested the female Palestinian refugee "DoaaNaji," 20 years during the raid campaigns this morning in Damascus suburb-Al Kiswa. It is worth mentioning that she is from the besieged Yarmouk Camp.

Egypt

The Palestinian Syrian Detainees in Karmouz prison at the city of Alexandria in Egypt renewed their demands to the Egyptian government to immediately release them and to end their suffering.

The Egyptian Attorney General had dropped the charge of illegal entry for the 56 Syrian and the Palestinian refugees who are detained in Karmouz police department and ordered their release on 5th of November 2014. Egyptian Interior Ministry issued a decision to deport them, but they're still in detention without charges after more than 150 days.



It is noted that there are 15 minors including the detainees, 7 of them less than 10 years, and one baby (10 months).

It should be noted that the Egyptian authorities have arrested "56" Palestinian refugees from Syria while trying to reach Italy from Turkish beaches 159 days ago after they were victims of a scam by smugglers who left them on one of the islands off the Egyptian shores.

Numbers and Statistics till 11/4/2015

- *At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 644 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 724 days, water was cut for 214 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 175 victims.*
- *80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51,300 in*

Lebanon and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.

- ***Al Husayneyya Camp:*** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **545** days respectively.
- ***Al Sbeina Camp:*** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **515** days respectively.
- ***Handarat Camp:*** - Residents have left the camp for **717** days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- ***Dara'a Camp:*** - It is now almost **361** days without water and **70%** of its buildings were demolished.
- ***Jermana, AL SaiedaZainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:*** - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- ***Khan Al Sheih Camp:*** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
