“Living Crises in Khan AL Sheih Camp Affects Bread”



Khan AL Sheih Camp

- Two Palestinians were killed in Syria, one of them under torture.
- Health and living crises in Dara'a camp and Al Muzaireib compound.
- Suspension of aids entry to the Yarmouk besieged camp for more than a year.
- Algeria arrests Palestinian refugees from Syria in charge of entering the country with fake passports.

Victim

- *Amjad Saeid Sbaihi from Muzaireib town in Dara'a was killed under torture in the Syrian security prisons after being arrested from Damascus for about a year. Amjad was a History student in Damascus University.*
- *Yousef Hasan Mohammed Matar died in 7-8-2014 and was buried between the Libyan and Sudanese borders while he was trying to reach Europe.*

Recent Updates

The living crises in Khan Al Sheih camp is still increasing after closing the only road that links the camp with the surrounding areas "Zakia-Khan Al Sheih". This closure has led to the suspension of entering food supplies to the camp which were originally limited quantities because of the difficulty of entering big quantities through this road due to the continuous clashes and snipping.

The camp is suffering of a severe shortage of bread, where the bread is completely ran out of the camp in addition to the severe shortage of basic food supplies, while the residents are suffering of water and power crises. The rest of refugees in Dara'a camp are still suffering, as the repeated shelling has fully destroyed large parts of the camp in addition to the large destruction of infrastructure which led to the complete stop of most of power and water services. Moreover, the camp suffers of an acute shortage of medical services due to the run out of medical supplies and the lack of medical personnel inside the camp. In Muzaireib compound, which hundreds of families from Dara'a camp have fled to it, the situation is almost exactly similar, where people are suffering of drinking water crisis and that is forcing them to buy water through the reservoirs "tanks" which increases their economic burdens.

On the other hand, for the second day respectively, the distribution of food aid to the trapped people in Yarmouk camp has stopped since more than a year, without giving reasons, where checkpoints of the Regular Army and groups of the Popular Front - General Command are still imposing a strict siege on the camp. Meanwhile, the remaining residents are still suffering on both sides of health and living conditions, and states



that most hospitals and clinics in the camp stopped working except Palestine Hospital which works with its minimum capacity.

Algeria

Algerian authorities arrested two Palestinian Syrian refugees while they were trying to travel to Europe through Algeria. The Two refugees were arrested in charge of entering the country with fake passports. Their Friends have asked about the two refugees while the authorities answered them “don’t come back to ask about them again, they will remain here for several days and then they will be released.” He said. The relatives of the two refugees are worried about them to be deported and handed to the Syrian authorities.

It is worth mentioning that the Algerian authorities arrested a Palestinian Syrian refugee for five days after arriving from Turkey to Algeria illegally while he was heading to travel European countries.
