"Demonstrations of 'Detainees First' Launched in European Cities in Participation of Activists and Released Palestinian Syrian Detainees"

Victims

The so-called "Shabab Alawda," Pro-Syrian Regime Movement, funeral two of its members who died while fighting at Deir Alzour area East of Syria. The military wing of the movement, "Aljaleel Palestinian Forces," issued a statement reported that Mohammed Abas Eid Almohammed and Esam Isa Alabas died during fighting at Deir Alzour area.

The military wing is considered as a military formation fighting alongside the Syrian Regime forces and led by the young man, Fadi Almallah, who is displaced from Khan Al Shieh camp. The movement attracts youth of Khan Dannon camp, in private, and other camps controlled by the Regime, in general. They attract youth with huge amounts of money and fulfilling all their needs.

These forces have participated in many fighting alongside the Syrian Regime, most important was Talet Mosa and Altalaga fighting, as they broke into Talat Alblokosat and Talat Alkhashiaa at Lathakeia, which resulted in the death of many fighters and the injury of many residents from Khan Dannon camp.





Recent Updates

Under the slogan of "Detainees First," demonstrations were implemented in the French capital "Paris and a number of European cities. The demonstrations shed light the issue of detainees in the prisons of the Syrian regime, and were launched in Paris from Place de la Bastille up to the Republic Square "Riboblak."

Demonstrators raise pictures of thousand martyrs and detainees in the Syrian regime's prisons, including pictures of Palestinian refugees who have died due to torture, and others who are still in the regime's prisons for years. Organizers of the demonstration designed metal cubic in the form of a cell, as they marched inside in the streets of the French capital to draw attention to the issue of detainees in prisons the Syrian regime.

Similar demonstrations were implemented in several European cities, most important is Lyon, France, Munich and Colin in Germany, and Swedish Kalmar, during which participants raise banners and pictures of detainees.

organizers of the event expressed fear that the file of the detainees and the process of their release is subject to political blackmail, in particular, with an attempt to manipulate them within the political deals among the conflict parties.

the organizers said, "We do not speak about all prisoners, including women and children deprived of their liberty, but for thousands of missing and abductees who are unaccounted for, and thousands of detainees abandoned to die of starvation or disease or under systematic



torture, what falls under the heading of crimes against humanity in accordance with Article VII of the Charter of Rome in 1998".



Turning to the western suburb of Damascus, where shelling targeted Alrida Street in Khan Al Shieh camp, causing panic among the residents, especially children, while the Syrian regime forces stationed in the regiment 137 continue to close the road between Khan Al Shieh and Zakia, as a result of being targeted with artillery and tank shells.

Zakia - Khan Al Shieh road is considered the only way that supplies the camp with supplies and essential needs, knowing that all roads leading to the camp are closed, forcing residents to go through Zakia road in spite of high seriousness, as it expose to shelling by the Syrian army, where many residents died while passing through it, as they called it "death road".

The AGPS documented the names of 14 victims from Khan Al Shieh camp who died at this road.

In a different context, Head of Research Department at the AGPS, Ibrahim Ali, demanded the UNRWA to find practical steps in order to



protect the Palestinian refugees in Syria, to support them with the needed relief materials, and not just issuing condemnation and denunciation statements".

The UNRWA issued a statement yesterday expressed a deep concern about targeting the Palestinian refugees in Syria in light of the ongoing armed conflict in the country, as it condemned the escalation of "armed conflict" in Syria, which has led in recent days to the killing of Palestinian refugees.



Ali pointed out that UNRWA statement follow-up the recent events that led to the killing and injuring a number of Palestinians, as no data were provided recently for many bloody events that took place against the Palestinian refugees, despite the weak impact of these data.

Al-Ali noted that UNRWA has limited its work to provide some aid to refugees outside the camps and compounds that they inhabit, where refugees are forced to get out of areas where they may be subjected to death, arrest, or theft in order to obtain the UNRWA's aid.



Statistics

The AGPS documentation and monitoring team announced that 27 Palestinian refugees died during May 2016, including 12 refugees died by gun shot, 10 refugees died due to shelling, 2 refugees died due to torture in the prisons of the Syrian regime, a refugee died by an explosion, a refugee died by a sniper shot, and another refugee died due to siege and lack of medical care.

The AGPS indicated that the Palestinian victims who died during last May were scattered according to the Syrian cities as follows:

7 refugees in Damascus, 12 refugees in Damascus suburb, 3 refugees in Aleppo, and 3 refugees died in one of the Syrian cities.

The number of Palestinian refugees who died due to the ongoing war in Syria has reached 3253 victims, according to the documented statistics of the AGPS.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 12\06\2016:

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan*
- *42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon*
- *6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015*
- *8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey*
- *1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza*

- *More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1093 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1154 days, water was cut for 643 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 947 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1 138 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 799 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
