Latest Developments

The Syrian regime army has stepped onslaughts on Daraa Camp and its environs, AGPS field correspondent reported on Monday.

As of Monday morning, the Syrian regime forces have dropped 16 barrel bombs containing napalm, 24 ground-to-ground missiles, and 30 naval mines on Daraa Camp and its vicinities.

At the same time, fierce clashes burst out near the Air Force Intelligence facility, east of Daraa Camp, between the opposition outfits and the government troops as the latter continue to make supreme efforts to grab hold of the area.



A couple of days earlier, the Syrian government forces launched 30 air strikes on Daraa AlBalad, Daraa Camp, and AlSadd Road. Over 80 barrel bombs and 80 ground-to-ground missiles, along with dozens of mortar shells slammed into the area, resulting in heavy material damage.

Meanwhile, reporting from Khan AlSheih Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Rif Dimashq, AGPS news correspondent said Syrian government delegates popped in the camp on Monday.



The delegation included Rif Dimashq governor Alaa Ibrahim and security and military officials.

Rif Dimashq governor pledged to work on unblocking the main access road to Khan AlSheih and rehabilitating much-needed facilities in the area, including power, water, and telecommunication networks.



Recently, Khan AlSheih residents have leveled heavy criticism at the Syrian government for renegeing on its promises to implement the reconciliation deal signed with the opposition outfits in November 2016.

Key to the deal was the retreat of the opposition fighters to the northern Syrian city of Idlib and the deportation of over 2,000 relief and media activists from the camp in exchange for promises to lift the government cordon and to allow civilians a safe access to their homes. However none of these pledges have materialized on the ground.

In a related development, activists and civilians sheltered in Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, appealed, in letters emailed to AGPS, to all concerned parties and UNRWA to work on reconstructing the camp and granting civilians a safe access to their homes, from which they have been



displaced for 1,500 consecutive days due to the fierce clashes rocking the area. The Syrian government forces seized the territory some 234 days ago.

The displaced civilians launched a cry for help over the abject situation they have been enduring due to the rampant hostilities, price hike, steep rental fees, and high rates of unemployment.

Activists said remnants of the internationally-prohibited cluster grenades, unleashed by the Russian and Syrian warplanes, have been spotted in the camp, warning that they might explode at any possible moment.

Nearly 90% of civilian buildings and facilities in Handarat have been partially or totally reduced to rubble due to the unabated offensives rocking the camp.

In another development, 33-year-old Palestinian refugee Mootaz Mohamed Bakr, from Aleppo-based AlAydeen Camp in Homs, has been held in Syrian government lock-ups for the fourth year running.

AGPS kept record of the names of 1,603 Palestinian detainees in Syrian regime penitentiaries, among whom 100 female refugees.

Civil Action Committees

The Palestine Charity Commission distributed 189 food baskets to Palestinian refugees from Syria, mostly orphans, the elderly, and people with special needs, in AlZeina Valley, south of Lebanon.



The move makes part of the “Ramadan Food Basket” campaign launched by the charity as part of ongoing endeavors to alleviate the dire situation endured by the displaced Palestinian families from Syria.

According to UNRWA estimates until December 2016, some 31,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria have been taking shelter in Lebanon.



Palestinians of Syria: June 12, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,514 Palestinians, including 462 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,603 Palestinian refugees, including 100 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,421 days in a row.*
- *196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,156 and 1,007 days.*
