“Vietnamese Authorities Release Palestinian Syrian Detainees after One Month Detention, and Continuous Crises and Immigration at Al Aedein Camp in Homs”

Vietnam

The Vietnamese authorities release Palestinian Syrian migrants who were detained in its prisons months ago after they entered its territories illegally, while the Palestinian Foreign Affairs in Ramallah announced that this release came after a series of communications and negotiations with the Vietnamese Side, that resulted in their release and the exemption of financial penalty, resulting from their illegal presence in its territory, in condition of immediate leaving.

The Palestinian Foreign Affairs added that the refugees will travel to Malaysia, in accordance with the Laotian Foreign Affairs after providing them with tickets, since their financial conditions is bad. The refugees arrived to Kuala Lumpur safely, and a number of Palestinian refugees had entered the Vietnamese territory and have been exposed to fraud by smuggling traders, as they were entered with forged passports to Vietnam, as a transit station for access to asylum countries.

Recent Updates

The Palestinian Jordanian refugee "Abdullah Reziq", was born on 1955, was found killed yesterday at the Yarmouk camp south of the Syrian capital Damascus, while our correspondent reported that "Reziq", a member of Fatah Movement, was found killed at his house and there were signs of being beaten with a sharp tool, while our correspondent mentioned that the killers were not identified yet.

Meanwhile, the residents of the Yarmouk camp are still suffering of the loss of all food supplies due to the siege imposed by the regular army and the PFGC groups for 556 days respectively, and also due to the suspension of food aids provided by UNRWA since 10-12-214, which made them susceptible to starve to death again and having to search in garbage containers and drink pepper soup which previously caused many diseases to them.

In the same context, the people of the Yarmouk camp and a number of activists demanded the institutions of civil work to enter food and to treat them similarly as to Adjacent areas, and in turn, the PLO Political Bureau Director, Ambassador 'Anwar Abdel Hadi" emphasized that the solution to the camp crisis is linked to the topic of "insurgents" in the surrounding areas; such as AL Hajar Al Aswad, Al Tadamon, and Yalda, which constitute an important supply area for them.

In Aleppo, the young man "Thaer Dahudy" from Al Nairab camp, had minor injuries after the fall of anti-aircraft gun shots, as a result of violent clashes between the Syrian army and armed opposition groups in the surroundings, that caused a state of panic and tension among the residents, and also caused mobilization of all the medical staff and civil work committees, in case of any emergency or unexpected event.

It is noteworthy that the camp, which is controlled by the regular army, is one of the strategic areas, since it is close to Nairab military airport.

On the other hand, the people of Sbeina camp, for the 427 days, are still prevented of returning to their homes after the Syrian army and Palestinian groups loyal to it control over the region.

The camp had been exposed to shelling and crippling siege, since the Syrian army forces prevented the entry of food and medical supplies, causing a stoppage of the bakery due to the lack of fuel, and flour, in addition to the power and communications cut. The forces also closed the roads leading to the camp, and after violent clashes and shelling that targeted the residents and the Syrian opposition groups, the Syrian army was able to control it and to expel people from their homes.

Meanwhile, homes re looted and theft, as well as the destruction that hit more than 60% of the homes, it is worth mentioning that the AGPS documentation and monitoring team has documented the names of 66



refugees died from Sbeina camp due to the ongoing war in Syria, while 25 other people were arrested.

In a related context, the Al Aedein camp in Homs are complaining of the rising prices and the scarcity of all food and fuel, due to the ongoing war in Syria, and to the bad weather that hit Syria and the Middle East. They also complain of power outages for long hours, the thing that continuously leads to food spoilage and material losses.

The residents of the camp also have difficulties to secure gas for cooking and heating at high prices, prompting them, within the obstruction of the Syrian army checkpoints of entering heating materials, to make use of firewood for heating and cooking, in light of the obscene high prices, the spread of unemployment, and poor financial resources.

In Damascus suburb, the residents of Khan Dannon camp live miserable living conditions as a result of the lack of basic services, where they are suffering from a shortage of bread and continued electricity, water and telecommunications cut for long hours that may reach up to more than 16 hours a day.

UNRWA

"SamierAbdulrahem", Director of the Regional Education Program of UNRWA, issued special instruction about the timetable of the first semester exams, 2014-2015, while the instructions confirmed that Monday 12th of January is an official time in all of UNRWA schools, and asked the students and teachers to bound by this decision.

Meanwhile, the school administration demanded the implementation of the exams, according to the previous scheme (test program), it also authorized the schools administration to share two articles tests in one day on (Tuesday, Wednesday Thursday) 13- 41-15 January (according to the possibilities).

The Director of Education at UNRWA noted that he will issue a formal statement which explains the procedures regarding the examinations that were completed because of weather.

The Department of Education at UNRWA announced the closure of all schools on Monday, 12th of January at Bekaaregion in Lebanon regarding the conditions of climate and the closure of all the roads because of snow, while the Department of Education indicated that Tuesday, 1/13 will be an official time .

Lebanon

Deputy political official of " Hamas " in Lebanon, Raafat Marra, assumed that the situation of Palestinians, who fled from Syria to Lebanon, is most tragic of the refugee in Lebanon camps, because they live far away from what can help them to overcome this matter; such as clothes, houses and food, within the continuous reduction of UNRWA services to them.

The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics till 13/1/2015

- *At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*



- 2600 Palestinian refugees were documented by the AGPS including 157 women, 286 were killed due to torture, 267 were killed by sniper shot, 84 refugees were field executed, and 985 refugees were killed due to bombing.
- The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 556 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 636 days, water was cut for 125 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 159 victims.
- 80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 14348 refugees in Jordan, 42,000 in Lebanon, according to UNRWA statistics till November 2014.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 458days respectively.
- Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 427days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 629 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 273days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL SaiedaZainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
