"5 Palestinian Victims Died in Syria, Including Two Brothers Died due to Torture"

Victims

The two brothers, "Ibrahim and Ayman Khazae" from Yarmouk-Alorouba Street died under torture in the prisons of the Syrian regime, after being detained for about more than a year and a half, bringing the statistics of torture victims documented by the AGPS to "410" Palestinian victims.

Meanwhile, the Palestinian female refugee "Mona Fathi Shehadeh" from Jaramana camp also died by shells' shrapnel that was fired by the Syrian opposition groups on various parts of the capital, Damascus.

The Palestinian young man Mahmoud Shammout, a resident of Yarmouk in Yalda, also died by sniper shot of Al-Nusra Front stationed in buildings opposite to the town of Yalda adjacent to the camp. It was mentioned that he is the fifth of his family members, including his father, who died earlier by the Syrian army and its affiliated groups.

The Palestinian refugee "Ihab Ahmed Mezal" died while participating in the fighting alongside the armed opposition groups, after they tried to



storm the barracks of the Syrian army in Alhoboub barracks within the so-called "south storm" battle.

Recent Updates

A number of mortar shells targeted different parts of the Yarmouk camp, and resulted in only material damages, coincided with clashes described as violent between the regular army alongside PFGC groups and groups affiliated to ISIS and Nusra on several axes near the Yarmouk high school.

It is worth mentioning that the regular army and PFGC groups impose a strict siege on the Yarmouk refugee camp for more than (772) days, resulting in extremely harsh living conditions, which exacerbated after ISIS storming since the beginning of April.

In Damascus suburb, mortar shell landed yesterday on the vicinity of Saed Street in the western part of Khan Al Shieh camp, while artillery fire and machine guns targeted and combed the surrounding farms.

The shelling targeted the road between (Khan Alshieh_ Zakya), which is the only outlet for residents and connects the camp with the capital



Damascus, with heavy machine guns located within the Syrian army site, "the regiment 137". Zakia- Khan Alshieh is the only way where food and medical supplies, etc. enter the camp, while many victims died there by bombing and sniping.

In a different context, Thimar Charity Institution continues providing relief aid and food to the besieged people of Yarmouk and displaced at Yalda, Babbila, and Beit Sahem areas. The institution distributes drinking water to residents due to continued water cuts at all lanes and houses of the camp for (331) days respectively.

Meanwhile, Al Wafaa European campaign completed its thirteen visits to Syrian territory, which succeeded in the distribution of approximately 2000 food parcels to the people of the Yarmouk refugee camp.





In the meantime, the Syrian security services released Palestinian refugees from Alaedein camp in Homs, and another refugee from Khan Dannoun camp in Damascus suburb; they are: Mohammed Ismail Omar, 'Abu Omar' in his fifties, from Al Aedein camp, originally from Alshajara village in Palestine, and was released from Homs Central prison after being detained for almost three months.

Ayman Mohammed Khateeb 'Abu Mohammed', in his sixties, from Al Aedein camp, originally from Ein Alzaytoun village in Palestine, was released after being detained for five days. It was mentioned that he is a lieutenant colonel in the Preventive Security of the Palestinian Authority in Ramallah.

Syrian security forces released the Palestinian refugee "Mohammed Fathi Abdel-Aal," from Khan Dannon camp in Damascus suburb, after being detained for a year.

Lebanon

The Lebanese Army released the detained Palestinians of Syria families, who are 20 people, after the appeals of their relatives to the concerned sides and the Palestinian and humanitarian organizations to interfere to release their families, who were detained by the Lebanese army two days ago while returning back from Tripoli city to Sour.

It is referred that their release was after the interference of the Palestinian Organization for Human Rights Shahed, which met with the families and transmitted their news and appeals. In a different context,



the Palestinian refugees in Lebanon carried out a sit-in in front of the main center of UNRWA at Tripoli north of Lebanon protesting on the UNRWA services reduction to the Palestinian refugees in the five areas.

The sit-in came as a rejection of the policy of UNRWA seeking to postpone the school year and cut salaries for employees.



Within the sit-in organized by the UNRWA Workers Union with participation of Palestinians of Syria Committee in Lebanon, Nahr al-Bared refugee camp, refugees confirmed that Palestinians of Syria and Lebanon are in the same boat, and only refugees will be schools affected by postponement of the school year.

They also emphasized that school closures will be followed by the closure of the vocational training centers, and therefore these steps will kill the hopes and the future of an entire generation of o Palestinian refugees who rely on them in the process of return and liberation, pointing out that this act and decision is one of the red lines that cannot be bypassed and defending.



Numbers and Statistics till 12/8/2015

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 772 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 841 days, water was cut for 331 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 177 victims.*
- *Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 652 days respectively.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 633 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 834 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 478 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jarmana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.*
