"2 Palestinian Brothers Sheltered in Khan Al-Sheih Kidnapped by Gov't forces, One Released Following Health Setback"

Latest Developments

Reporting from Damascus suburbs, AGPS news correspondent said two Palestinian brothers—Mohamed Mustafa Hamad and Ahmad Hamad—were kidnapped from their own homes in Khan Al-Sheih Camp for Palestinian refugees.

Diabetes-stricken Ahmad was released shortly afterwards, as his health has taken a turn for the worse.

The two brothers had been residents of Artouz area, in Rural Damascus, before the retreat of the opposition outfits.



According to AGPS figures, 123 Palestinians sheltered in Khan Al-Sheih are incarcerated in Syrian regime lock-ups.

Meanwhile, a couple of days earlier, the Syrian government forces struck Fatah Al-Sham-led areas in northern Yarmouk Camp with heavy artillery and mortar shells.



The onslaught targeted Yarmouk's northern outskirts, along with Al-Sporat Street in the adjacent Al-Tadhamun neighborhood.

The Syrian government forces and their Palestinian abettors have been grabbing hold of the camp for 1,304 days running, blocking civilians' movement inside and out.



Residents of Al-Rija have also been subjected to a twofold cordon imposed by ISIS militias and the government battalions.

Meanwhile, residents of Al-Sbeina Camp called on the regime army and its affiliates to allow them a safe access to their homes, from which they have been displaced for 1,157 days running due to the bloody hostilities between the government forces and anti-regime outfits.

According to eye-witnesses, 80% of civilian homes and facilities in the camp have been razed to the ground, most precisely in the area stretching from Muadh Ibn Jabal Mosque to the so-called Al-Akrad Oven.



The situation has gone far worse due to the high unemployment rates and lack of financial resources.

Civil Action Commissions

The Palestine Charity Commission, in partnership with an anonymous donor, said it managed to secure toddler milk for Palestinian triplets in Al-Muzeireeb town, in southern Syria, for four months.

Residents of southern Syria have been subjected to dire living conditions due to the ban slapped by the regime army on the entry of much-needed medicines.

The government offensives on local hospitals, along with the ban imposed by the Jordanian authorities on the entry of Palestinian refugees seeking urgent treatment, have added fuel to fire.





Palestinians of Syria: January 13, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,419 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,146 Palestinian refugees, including 80 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,304 days in a row.*
- *190 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,008 and 823 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,351 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 85 days.*
- *Government troops ban residents of Al-Sbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,157 days running.*
- *Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
