Latest Developments

Two Palestinian refugees were killed in the raging hostilities in southern Syria.

Refugee Jumua Mohamed Hussein Al Moussa died after an artillery shell slammed into Deraa. The other casualty—Khaled Ahmad Nassar, a resident of Deraa Camp, was killed on Sunday, February 12, as he took part in anti-government battles in Deraa.

AGPS kept account of the death of 3,441 Palestinian refugees since the outburst of the Syrian conflict, 206 among whom identified as residents of Deraa Camp, in southern Syria.

Meanwhile, the Syrian government forces struck the Deraa Camp for Palestinian refugees with heavy machinegun fire and artilleries, resulting in serious material damage.



The government troops further targeted the adjacent Al Sadd Road, housing Palestinian families, with a ground-to-ground missile, at the



same time as Deraa Al Balad neighborhood had been struck by the Syrian fighter jets.

Tension has reached a zenith in Southern Syria and Deraa after the opposition outfits announced their intent to embark on a so-called “Operation Better Die than Be Humiliated” to grab hold of the strategic Al Menshiya quarter in Deraa, which oversees the city center and gives a panoramic view of the Brigade 32 base in northern Deraa along with the military police station and Hmeida Al Taher site.

In another development, ISIS militias in Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees, in southern Damascus, arrested a newly-married couple on allegations of tying the knot outside the ISIS-run shariah court.



Eye-witnesses said the marriage contract was struck according to conventional customs and in the presence of a lawyer and two witnesses.

The groom was reportedly flogged 18 times and subjected to imprisonment while the bride had her hair shaved entirely after she was flogged.



Sources inside Yarmouk said recently ISIS has invalidated several marriage agreements held in the shariah courts operating in the southern Damascus towns of Yalda, Babilla, and Beit Sahem.

Those who strike a marriage deal at a government court are systematically charged with apostasy.

According to the same sources, Yarmouk brides-to-be and grooms-to-be rarely show up at such courts.

Residents of Yarmouk Camp have often launched cries for help over the crackdowns and oppressive policies pursued by ISIS militants ever since they grabbed hold of the shelter in April 2015.

Meanwhile, Palestinian resident of Al Raml Camp in Latakia, Khamees Hassan Al Hariri, aged 34, has had a mysterious fate in Syrian government lock-ups.



The detainees' families appealed to the U.N. and the concerned human rights and humanitarian institutions to urge the Syrian government to release their relatives and disclose their fates.



According to AGPS data, 1,163 Palestinian detainees are incarcerated in Syrian regime prisons.

Civil Action Commissions

The Palestine Charity Commission continues to provide humanitarian assistance and in-kind relief items to Palestinian refugees in southern Syria.

Recently, the commission handed over 50 free medical prescriptions in Al Muzireeb town, to the northwest of Deraa province, and which shelters nearly 8,500 Palestinian refugees.

The commission further delivered 5,000 SYP as monthly allowances to 55 orphans in the area, along with \$2,500 donated by the Shourouq Al Shams Foundation in Al Muzeireeb to boost orphans' funds.

Palestinian refugees across Deraa have been enduring abject living conditions. Chronic water and power blackouts, along with the unabated offensives on Deraa Camp, forced hundreds of families to seek shelter in Al Muzeireeb town, among other southern Syrian areas.

Palestinians of Syria: February 1 - 3, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,441 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,164 Palestinian refugees, including 83 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*

- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,334 days in a row.*
- *190 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,038 and 845 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,382 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 117 days.*
- *Government troops ban residents of Al-Sbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,187 days running.*
- *Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
