"Syrian Warplanes Launch 12 Raids at Daraa Camp and its Vicinity"

Recent Updates

Heavy shelling targeted Daraa camp and Alsad road adjacent to the camp, in the early hours of yesterday morning, where the Syrian warplanes launched 12 raids on the two regions, causing material damage to residents' houses.

Syrian warplanes are still hovering overhead, while clashes were intensified on the sided of Daraa camp between the regular army and armed opposition groups.

It is noteworthy that the southern region exposed to the bombing of the Syrian warplanes since the southern front factions in the Syrian armed opposition announced the launch of 'south storm' battle on June 25, in order to control areas under the control of government forces in Daraa governorate.

On the other hand, Palestinian media reported that Fatah movement (the storm) re-opened its offices in Damascus, after a break that lasted for more than 32 years, after the Syrian regime approval to the reopening of



the movement's offices, and after accrediting Dr. Samir Rifaito be the movement dependent in Syria.

This comes after the death of (2974) Palestinian refugees in Syria, including 411 refugees died under torture in the Syrian regime's prisons, and 180 refugees died because of the siege imposed on Yarmouk by the regular Syrian army and PFGC groups.



Many Palestinian activists in Syria denounced that and expressed their wonder of what they described as reconciliation on the blood of refugees in the Palestinian camps in Syria.

In a related context, "Medical Surgical Rescue Center" in Yarmouk appealed medical bodies, institutions, and doctors League to assume their responsibilities towards the besieged civilians in the Yarmouk refugee camp, as deaths increased due to lack of medicines, health care, and suitable potential.

Dr. "Riad Idriss," the center's director, said on the center website, that the center failed to make some ambulatory operations due to the lack of anesthetics, and stressed that the region is facing health epidemics such as typhoid fever, hepatitis and others, in addition to our inability to secure medicines for chronic diseases such as diabetes and high blood pressure. "

Dr. Riad warned and directed appeals to remedy the current situation and save thousands of civilians trapped in the Yarmouk refugee camp.

Meanwhile, the medical center in Yarmouk documented statistics for the most common infectious diseases diagnosed during the last four months from 04/08/2015 to 8-8-2015, and were documented names:

Hepatitis (A), 69 cases, jaundice and typhoid fever, 94 cases, upper respiratory infections, 160 cases, gastrointestinal infections, 94 cases, Maltese fever, 5 cases.

In Aleppo, Syrian security forces arrested a special needs Palestinian youth "Adham Mohammed Naji" 17-year-old from Neirab, while returning from his work in the city of Aleppo.

The AGPS documented the names of 75 detainees from Neirab, while the total toll of Palestinian detainees in Syrian prisons since the start of the crisis is 942 detainees.

In Lebanon, dozens of displaced Palestinians of Syria refugees in Lebanon participated in the sit-in, which the factions and the Palestinian popular and civil committees in Lebanon called for it. The sit-in was in



front of the UNRWA office at sour city south of Lebanon, the protestors expressed their refusal to the latest UNRWA decision about the services reduction. They considered the decisions as methodical policy to cancel the Palestinian refugees issue and their right of return to their houses in Palestine.

The protestors called the PLO, PA, and the Palestinian factions to rapidly move to put an end to the reduction of UNRWA services.



Numbers and Statistics till 13/8/2015

- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 773 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 842 days, water was cut for 332 days

respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 177 victims.

- *Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 653 days respectively.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 634 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 835 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 479 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jarmana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.*
