"Residents of Khan Al-Sheih Displaced to Idlib Urge UNRWA to Take up Its Responsibilities"

Latest Developments

Palestinian residents of Khan Al-Sheih who have been displaced to Idlib and its suburbs appealed to UNRWA to take urgent action as regards their tragic state of affairs.

The displaced civilians further called on UNRWA to include them in the 2017 assistance program.



UNRWA is expected to deliver its cash allowances as of January 15, 2017 until March 16, 2017.

Speaking with AGPS, a Palestinian refugee sounded distress signals over the high rental fees along with the chronic power and water blackouts rocking the area.

Residents of Idlib have been enduring abject living conditions due to the lack of medical care and high unemployment rates.

The damage inflicted on infrastructure, including schools, hospitals, and civilian facilities, have made life unbearable in the area.



As of Monday, November 28, 2016, some 2,500 Palestinian refugees have been displaced from their shelters in Khan Al-Sheih Camp to the northern Syrian province of Idlib, following a reconciliation accord struck between the Syrian government and the opposition outfits.

In a related development, residents of Al-Muzeireeb called on UNRWA to rally round them.

The residents spoke out against the life-threatening risks and difficulties they have been facing on way to UNRWA offices in Deraa.

Located some 11 km away from northwestern Deraa, in southern Syria, Al-Muzeireeb town has been a home to some 8,500 Palestinian refugees, along with hundreds of families displaced from Deraa.

In another development, 30-year-old Palestinian refugee Mohamd Mahmoud Mohamed has been locked up in Syrian government jails since January 24, 2013.





A resident of Yarmouk Camp, the detainee was kidnapped from his workplace in Dumar area, in western Damascus.

AGPS documented the incarceration of 1,146 Palestinian refugees in Syrian regime lock-ups, among whom 81 female refugees who have had unknown fates.

At the same time, the Qatari Red Crescent and the Palestinian Red Crescent organizations in Lebanon, in cooperation with the Palestine Children's Relief Fund and the Syrian American Medical Society Foundation, announced their decision to provide Palestinian and Syrian children sheltered in Lebanon with free bone surgeries and medical follow-ups.

Children aged below 17-years-old and whose treatment is uncovered by the UN commission will receive free surgeries, with the exception of those diagnosed with kyphosis and scoliosis.

The mission does not, however, comprise charges of medical shoes, artificial limbs, plastic materials, and transportation fees.

Palestinians of Syria: January 14, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,419 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,147 Palestinian refugees, including 81 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,305 days in a row.*
- *190 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,009 and 824 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,352 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 87 days.*
- *Government troops ban residents of Al-Sbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,158 days running.*
- *Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
