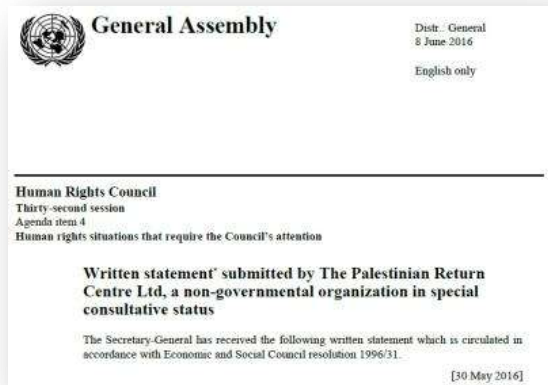

Recent Updates

Human Rights Council of the United Nations adopted a written statement filed by the Palestinian Return Centre in London as a document of its regular meeting, where the statement contains all details related to more than (3235) Palestinian victims in terms of distribution and causes of death. The statement was based on the AGPS statistics, as it addressed information about the Yarmouk refugee camp siege, the humanitarian situation in the rest of the Palestinian refugee camps there, as well as Palestinian prisoners and torture victims, who are at least 445. The report pointed out the poor economic situation suffered by the Palestinians of Syria inside Syria and in countries where they were displaced to.



This comes within the framework of the PRC to transfer the suffering of the Palestinian refugees in Syria to all international forums, based on human rights Statistics and reports issued by the AGPS and the other specialized human rights organizations.

The Palestinian refugee (Abu Yassin) - a pseudonym - (44 years) from the eastern Ghouta displaced to Beddawi camp in Tripoli, northern Lebanon, called to help him to pay his treatment costs. He had a transplant artery in left foot due to clogged heart artery, as the overall surgery costed him almost (\$ 7,250), UNRWA paid half the amount, while local institutions



and committees paid (\$ 1,850) as an assistance at the cost of treatment. Yet, he still needs (1800 \$) to complete the costs, as he is suffering from difficult economic conditions, while his health status continuing to deteriorate and if the process is delayed he may lose one of his feet.

Turning to the south of Syria, where the remaining refugees suffer of extremely dangerous humanitarian conditions manifested in the health and living sides, and the continuation of water cut since (800) days. The residents obtain drinking water difficulty, where sources of water are about at least 10 km away from the camp. Water is transferred to the camp by only one "tank" and, which is not enough for the minimum needs of water, because of the constant sniping of the streets by the regime forces and the continuation of the clashes

Despite the filling of the only water tank in the camp, water doesn't reach all houses of the camp due to the attached buildings, which obliged the residents to carry water with pots and water hoses.





Civil Work Committees

Jafrá organization distributed some food aid to the Palestinian families who were displaced from Yarmouk camp to the neighboring towns. According to a relief worker, the distribution process depended on the statistics of the Relief Work Committee.

It is mentioned that Yarmouk camp residents suffer from sever living situations due to the strict siege that is imposed on the camp by the Regular Army and the PFGC and the control of ISIS over wide spaces in the camp. In a related context, the water filling team at the Yarmouk Hope organization for Development and Services continue to distribute domestic water to a number of points in the overcrowded areas to alleviate their suffering to maintain their lives.



Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 14\06\2016:

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan*
- *42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon*

- *8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey*
- *1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza*
- *More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1095 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1156 days, water was cut for 645 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 949 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1 140 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 801 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
