Victims

Palestinian refugee Walid Suleiman AlAwadi and his brother Iyad Suleiman AlAwadi, sheltered in Tel Shehab village, in Daraa city, south of Syria, were pronounced dead after their cars blew up. Their brother sustained critical burns.

According to preliminary reports, the car detonated somewhere between Da'el and Nawa either because of a landmine or after it was directly hit in the raging warfare.



Latest Developments

16 Palestinians from Syria died during May 2017, down from 27 in May 2016, AGPS documentation team found out.

Rif Dimashq topped the list of casualties with six refugees, followed by Daraa, Deir AlZor, and Hama, with two victims each. Two refugees died, meanwhile, in Damascus and AlRiqa. Two more Palestinians were pronounced dead in unidentified locations.



As for the May 2016 casualties, 12 refugees died in Rif Dimashq and seven in Damascus. Five more refugees were pronounced dead in Aleppo and three others were killed in unknown locations.



In another development, the Russian and Syrian government fighter jets have stepped up onslaughts on Daraa Camp for Palestinian refugees and the surrounding towns using barrels bombs and ground-to-ground missiles.

AGPS field reporter said the pro-government warplanes dropped over 14 barrel bombs and 11 surface-to-surface missiles on and around the camp and Daraa AlBalad.

At the same time, violent clashes flared up between the government forces and the opposition outfits. Victims were reported on both sides.

Meanwhile, the Palestine Charity Commission distributed 360 Iftar (break-of-fast) meals to a number of displaced Palestinian families in Syria. Families sheltered in Qudsaya received 250 meals and those



sheltered in AlNeirab Camp received 70 meals. 40 meals were handed over to Palestinian families in AlAydeen Camp, in Hama.

In a related development, the Palestinian Embassy in Turkey, in partnership with IHH Humanitarian Relief Foundation, handed over cash aids and food baskets to a number of displaced Palestinian families from Syria in Turkey. Every family member received a sum of 100 Turkish Liras. One food box was distributed per every single family.

Some 8,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria have been enduring abject conditions in the Turkish territories due to the high rates of poverty and unemployment, along with the absence of relief assistance.



Palestinians of Syria: June 14, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,519 Palestinians, including 463 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,603 Palestinian refugees, including 99 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*

- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,423 days in a row.*
- *196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,158 and 1,009 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,502 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 236 days.*
- *Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until the end of 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
