Recent Updates

The Lebanese authorities prevented a Palestinian family to enter Lebanon despite an appointment was set with the Dutch Embassy for reunion procedures. The family, which consists of a woman and two children, refused to return back to Syria and sit-in at Al Masna' area between Syrian and Lebanese borders.

Activists insured for the AGPS that the Lebanese authorities agreed earlier to enter the mother because she holds a Palestinian Syrian travel document and prevented her two children.

This event shed light on the suffering that the Palestinian Syrian families live, and which separate the families' reunion, and become victims of rapid changing procedures when crossing the borders to Lebanon.



One of the most inhuman events; the Lebanese General Security prevented a woman that carries a new born baby to enter Lebanon while she was trying to join her husband and her five children. It is referred that the

number of Palestinians of Syria in Lebanon is 45000 refugees, according to UNRWA statistics.

In a related context, the Malaysian authorities released the Palestinian Syrian activist, Ibrahim Abu Kharej, who is a resident of the Yarmouk camp, after the UNHCR intervened to solve his case. According to news reported to AGPS, Abu Kharej will be deported to Canada.



It is mentioned that the Malaysian Authorities detained the Activist, Ibrahim Abu Kharej, on 8th of September 2015 in Kuala Lumpur airport and prevented him to enter its lands, then he left trying to reach Europe, but the Cambodian authorities returned him to Malaysia.

In Syria, the residents of Jaramana Camp in Damascus called the officials of the camp's services to solve the wastewater problem which was hugely increased and prevented the residents of the camp from movement.

The residents also complain from the continuous power and water cut all over the camp for long periods. It is noted that the camp suffers of overcrowd due to the big displacement from the Palestinian Camps in Damascus specially the Yarmouk, Husseneia, and Sbeina camps after war that affected their camps.

The camp is suffering from multiple crises; most notably the high rent of house and the increase in demand, prompting residents to live in stifling conditions, as well as unemployment rates also increase at a time when aid from charity organizations and UNRWA decreased, while residents complain that this aid does not cover all their needs.

Turning to Damascus suburb, where the regular army and some Palestinian groups continue to prevent people of Sbeina camp to return to their homes for 726 days respectively, after being forced to leave because of the violent clashes that broke out between the regular army and groups of the armed opposition, which ended with the regular army complete control over the camp.

According to eyewitness, more than 80% of the camp's buildings were almost destroyed specifically the area extends from Maaz bin Jabal mosque till the camp's bakery, known as Kurds bakery, which forms the western entrance of the camp.

The residents have fled to neighboring towns and camps, to find themselves in a new suffering, not only for leaving their homes, but also it affected all aspects of their lives that turned into a tragedy because of the



economic conditions, the spread of unemployment, and the poor financial resources.

Statistics

The AGPS monitoring and Statistics team confirmed that about 8% of the Palestinian victims who have been documented in Syria are females.

According to the AGPS statistics, 413 Palestinian females died due to bombing, siege, and torture to death in the Syrian regime's prisons.

It is worth mentioning that at least 3064 Palestinian refugees died till today due to various reasons, most notably bombing, clashes, siege, and torture to death.

Numbers and Statistics till 13/11/2015:-

- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 865 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 935 days, water was cut for 425 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 182 victims.

- Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 726 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 927 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 571 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.
