## Latest Developments

The Action Group's correspondent reported, based on local sources, that 8 members of ISIS left Al-Hajar Al-Aswad in the south of Damascus yesterday, in coordination with the Syrian regime forces.

Our reporter added that 7 members left on October 11th, from Al-Hajar Al-Aswad through the Syrian regime's checkpoint, "Maamal Bardy." 4 others, who are related to ISIS's former leader, Abu Hesham Al-Khaboury, left on Sunday, while 3 others left through the same checkpoint last Friday. Their destinations remain unknown.



The exit of ISIS's leaders and their relatives from the region continues, amid talks about finding a close solution, to end ISIS's control over Al-Hajar Al-Aswad and Yarmouk camp. The situation has not yet been decided for the members who will remain to face their fate, after all the leaders leave the region.

In the meantime, the Action Group's reporter in the south of Damascus stated that, the Tadamon area, adjacent to Yarmouk camp, saw the displacement of hundreds of families from the areas

controlled by ISIS in the neighborhood, to areas which are much safer. In addition to the displacement of the families living in the region controlled by ISIS in the direction of Yarmouk camp, after a day full of bombardments and clashes in the region.

On the field, Al-Tadamon neighborhood and Yarmouk camp are witnessing a cautious calm, after areas of the camp and neighborhood were subjected to bombardments, leading to the injury of a child and destructions to the residents' houses.

While field sources told the Action Group that the regime regained the control of all the areas under ISIS's domination, yesterday.



Regarding the injuries, our reporter said that a member of ISIS, called "Abu Odai Qanas," died during the clashes, while 3 members of the regime's forces died after being beheaded by ISIS's members. The members of ISIS toured with the heads around the areas they control in the south of Damascus.

About 3 thousand civilians are living under a continuous siege imposed by the Syrian regime and its affiliated groups, in addition to ISIS's tightening and its imposing of another siege on those living in the areas controlled by "Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham", in the north-west of the camp.

In the same context, the Action Group's correspondent said that, the 6 month old infant "Adnan Awad Moussa," was taken out from the southern area to the Jaffa hospital in the Mezzah region in Damascus, for the required treatment after he was wounded amid the rocket and artillery bombardment, which targeted Yarmouk camp on Wednesday.

A number of activists and dignitaries in Yelda, launched an appeal yesterday to mediate with the regime, to get the child out and save his life.

The Action Group's correspondent clarified that the child "Adnan Awad Moussa," was taken to a field hospital in Yelda, however he was in desperate need of being taken out to one of Damascus's hospitals for treatment, to undergo a tough surgery.

Under the title, "'Neither East nor West Jerusalem will remain Arab," hundreds of Palestinian-Syrians organized a sit-in today, in front of the UN Commission in Damascus, to condemn Trump's decision to recognize Jerusalem as the capital of the Israeli occupation.

During the protest, the Palestinian, Syrian and Arab student and youth organizations in Syria, demanded that the Palestinian leadership, "accelerates the disengagement from the Oslo Accords and to stop the security coordination and all forms of direct and indirect negotiations with the Zionist enemy," stressing that this decision will not change the situation in Palestine and that Jerusalem will remain the capital of the Arab Palestine.

The participants presented a note to the United Nations Office, in which they called for the implementation of the resolutions of the UN Security Council and resolutions of the UN General Assembly and the UN Security Council, with regard to the status of the occupied city of Jerusalem, including the Resolution 194, which calls for the return of Palestinian refugees to their homeland, and the 1980 resolution declaring the Israeli measures to change the trait of the occupied city of Jerusalem.

In another context, the Turkish Coast Guards announced that they managed to rescue 68 illegal immigrants on Wednesday, who were stuck inside a rubber boat, in a rocky area off the coast of Izmir, in the west of the country.

The Turkish Coast Guard noted that they had received a notification, on the presence of a group of illegal migrants, trying to reach the Greek islands on a rubber boat. As a result of the research and monitoring operations, the teams were able to locate the boat inside the sea, pointing out that they were only able to start the rescue operations in the early hours of dawn, using boats and helicopters in the rescue operation.

The influx of Palestinian and Syrian refugees fleeing the Syrian war continues, towards Greece to reach the countries of asylum, while hundreds are waiting on the Turkish territory to ride the death boats, despite the poor weather conditions.

### **Palestinians of Syria: December 14, 2017 Statistics:**

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3616, including 463 women
- 1644 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 106 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,611 days in a row
- 204 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1348 days, and 1188 days in Yarmouk Camp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,684 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 447 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
