- **The Action Group: 269 Palestinian refugees were killed due to torture in the Syrian regime prisons.**

Victims

The two brothers Mohammed and Saleh Sh'habi Al Harrou, from Khan AL Sheih Camp in Damascus city, were killed due to torture in the Syrian regime prisons, which raises the victims of torture toll to 296 victims according to the statistics of the Action Group for Palestinians of Syria. The young man Bilal Yasein Halawa from Khan Dannoun Camp and a member of the PLA was killed by a landmine explosion.

Meanwhile, each of Maher Khalid Al Sayeida and Odai AL Sayied from the Yarmouk camp were killed during the clashes that broke out between the Opposition groups and the Regular Army alongside with PFGC at the cross of Al Yarmouk Municipality Palestine Street.

Recent Updates

Artillery shell targeted Khan AL Sheih Camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus City yesterday evening, while the roads that linking the camp to the adjacent areas are still close, which force the residents to take Zakia-Khan Al Sheih road which is exposes to bombing and snipping repeatedly.

In terms of living aspect, the residents are complaining of the deterioration of medical services in addition to the shortage of many necessary food supplies because of the closed roads.



On the other hand, the Yarmouk refugee Camp in Damascus is threatened by epidemics, especially in light of the water cut for the 37th day respectively, and the power cut since about 550 days. Water and power cut Enhances the possibility of the epidemics spread, especially the epidemics related to hygiene due to the lack of water and the difficulty of securing it, while the strict siege that imposed by the Regular Army is still continue for the 469 day respectively.

In the same context, the water crisis is still continue at Daraa and Al Nairab Camps, as in Daraa Camp, the water cut for 185 days, and AL Nairab Camp in Aleppo the water cut for the second day.

In Damascus city, the Regular Army still prevent the residents of Al Husseniea and Al Sbeina Camps to return back to their homes, despite its complete control, with the groups that loyal to it, of the camp. The Regular Army prevent the residents after heavy clashes broke out between them and Opposition groups which forced the residents to leave Al Husseniea camp for 369 days, and Sbeina camp for 339 days. The residents of the two camps are living in tough conditions due to the high cost of living, the houses rents, the spread of unemployment, and the security tension.

in Greece, the Action Group for Palestinians of Syria received news about that the Greek coast guards recued a boat was heading to Italy and was carrying a number of Palestinian Syrian and Syrian refugees. According to the news, the Greek Police forced the refugees to return back to Greece, while the boat was launched from Greece to Italy on 13-10-2014.

The Situation of the Palestinian Camps in Syria:

- ***The Yarmouk Camp:*** - The Continuance of the siege by the Regular Army and PFGC for the **469** respectively in addition to the power cut for more than **550** days and the water cut for **37** days respectively. The number of the siege victims is **155** victims.
- ***Al Husayneyya Camp:*** - The Regular Army still prevents the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for the **369** days respectively.
- ***Al Sbeina Camp:*** - The Regular Army still prevents the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for the **339** days respectively.
- ***Handarat Camp:***-The residents left the camp since **538** days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled the camp.
- ***Dara'a Camp:*** - Almost **184** days without water and a complete absence of basic services.
- ***Khan Al Sheih Camp:***-bombing targeted the vicinity of the Camp and the roads that linking the camp to the city center are still closed.
- ***Khan Danoun Camp:*** - economic crises and difficulties of finding houses due to the overcrowding of the camp.
- ***Al Nairab Camp:*** - the power is still cut for more than a year.
- ***Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:*** - relative calm situation in light of the economic crises.
