Recent Updates

Palestinians of Syria youth live a state of extreme tension, following the news of a presidential decree by the Syrian regime states the immediate military recruitment for any youth or man born in 1973 and until 1998.

According to media websites close to the regime, the Syrian Arab army units, Special Forces, and concerned authorities all over Syria began rounds in the streets and roads of the cities in order to check any youth or man obliged to the military service and transferred to the concerned authorities to be assigned to military service."



Another websites reported arrests of university students from the streets of Damascus, some of whom are not obliged to military service because they are classified as a single or otherwise.

Some of them were taken to the military police in Kaboun neighborhood to be allocated or to make sure of their military status, while others were forced to moves and mounds on military fronts."

It is worth mentioning that the Palestinian Syrian refugee is obliged to perform the PLA military service, which is part of the Syrian regular



army; participated in many battles of the Syrian regime especially in Damascus suburb.

Meanwhile, Syrian warplanes retargeted the vicinity of Khan Al Shieh camp and the neighboring farms with at least two explosive barrels; sounds of the explosion were heard clearly inside the camp.

The regular army checkpoints continue closing all connecting roads between the camp and the center of the capital Damascus, forcing the residents to use (Khan Al Shieh - Zakya) road to reach Damascus, as it has been targeted frequently by missiles and heavy machine guns.

Turning to the south of Syria, residents of Daraa camp are still suffering because of shelling and repeated clashes since the beginning of the ongoing war, which resulted in the destruction of about 70% of buildings, according to unofficial statistics.

The remaining refugees are suffering from severe dangerous humanitarian situations especially regarding health and living aspects.

In a different context, AGPS documented 12 Palestinian detainees from Muzareeb compound in Daraa in the Syrian regime's prisons including a female refugee, and their fate is still unknown until the moment.

The detainees are: Zakaria Hajras, 26 years from Moasah clan, and was arrested in 2013, Mahmoud Abdullah Mnazel, 25 years from Subaih Arabs, and was arrested in April 2013, Mohammad Khalil Almisawi, known as Abu Azmi, 35 years from Moasah clan, and was arrested in 2013, Marwan Frookh, 35 years from Al- Hip Arabs, and was arrested on 2013, Yussif Jouhar, 41 years from the Subaih Arabs, and was arrested



on 2013, Mohammed Ali Awad, known as Abu Obeida, 48 years from Subaih Arabs and was arrested in March 2014, Louay Al-Daly, 22 years, from Subaih Arabs, and was arrested in April 2014, Mohammed Mohsen Kharroubi, 30 years, from Kheranbh Arabs, and was arrested in 2014, Faisal Abu Shella, 35 years, from Al-Qaderia clan, and was arrested in July 2014, Jihad Mustafa Atallah, 48 years from Wuhaib Arabs, and was arrested in 2014, Ali AqlahAwad, 35 years, and was arrested in 2014, and the Palestinian refugee Jasmine Morretah, 20 years from Al- Hip Arabs, and was arrested in December 2014 in Daraa by the pro-Syrian security groups.



It is mentioned that Muzareeb compound for Palestinian refugees southern Daraa includes about 8,500 refugees, in addition to a number of families who were displaced from Daraa camp.

Greece

The Palestinian refugee, Firas Dawoud, who suffers of German measles that affected his vision, appealed European and Palestinian humanitarian and human rights organizations, led by Doctors Without Borders Organization to help him move from Greece to the Nordic borders for treating his eyes.



According to activists, the condition of Firas, who is displaced from the Yarmouk camp, is deteriorating after the hazardous journey to get to Greece, as he has survived in the first time of a drawn incident and succeeded to cross the Aegean Sea between Turkey and Greece.



It is noteworthy that the refugee "Firas" is now in the Greek island of CEOS, and suffers from poor health services there, exacerbating his suffering, in addition to the immediate need to transplant stem cells for treating his eyes where that surgery is not available in Greece.

It is worth mentioning that a number of Palestinian activists launched appeals several days ago to help "Firas" but any relief or human rights agencies have moved yet.

Lebanon

Palestinians of Syria Committee in Lebanon finished the initial of Photoshop training course set up for a number of Palestinian refugees from Syria in Lebanon, attended by 40 trainees from the Palestinian Syrian refugees from all Lebanese regions.



At the end of the course, the two professors, Mr. Kamel Kuzbar, director of Al Iman secondary school, and the coach Waseem Wani were honored in recognition of their efforts in training, development, and rehabilitation of the Palestinian Syrian and the Syrian refugees in a humanitarian center.

Chairman of the Committee, Ibrahim Ali said: "This session is a part of goals set by the Committee regarding rehabilitation and training of Palestinian refugees from Syria and upgrading the performance of scientific and intellectual level, and preparing them for the job market."



Numbers and Statistics till 15/11/2015

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 867 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 937 days, water was cut for 427 days*

respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 182 victims.

- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 728days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 929 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 573 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.*
