Victims

A Palestinian child was killed by the explosion of a landmine of unknown origin in Shamal al-Khat neighborhood in Dara'a Al Mahatta, in southern Syria on Thursday 16/05/2019, AGPS reporter said.

The child Mahmoud Fadi Derbi, housed in Dera'a camp, died of wounds he sustained after the blast of unfamiliar object he was playing with in the streets of Shamal Al-Khat in Dara'a, AGPS reporter added, noting that the child was immediately taken to a hospital in Damascus city for treatment where he died later.



Two Palestinian children, Omar Mohammed Asad, 10, and Mohammed Samir Hamamda, 9, from Sayeda Zeinab camp died on 10/05/2019 in a landmine blast in al-Bahdalia in the countryside of Damascus.

Latest Development

In a statement released on May 16, the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA) condemned the rocket attack on Neirab camp in Aleppo that killed at least ten civilians and wounded more than 30 others, including four children, the youngest just six years old. A number of the injured remain in critical condition.

On its official website, the UNRWA announced that because of the ongoing hostilities around the Neirab camp and the ensuing deteriorating security situation it has been forced to suspend the six schools that it runs within the camp – impacting more than 3,000 children. UNRWA notes that while it has opened its schools in Neirab camp today, it does so with the sad knowledge that three of its students will not be joining the final preparations for the end-of-year exams.

It called on all parties to the conflict to abide by their obligations under international humanitarian law, namely in taking all precautionary measures to ensure the protection of civilians during hostilities, stressing that it condemns the killing and wounding of all civilians, including Palestine refugees.

The dramatic escalation in hostilities in northwestern Syria leaves UNRWA concerned for an estimated 10–20,000 Palestine refugees who are displaced in that area. The relief agency wishes to join calls by other humanitarian actors in Syria for an end to the terrible suffering of civilians.

Palestinian Alaa Mohammed Hussein, housed in Sbeina camp, was slightly injured during clashes between armed Syrian opposition groups and the Syrian army in Downtown Dara'a, southern Syria. He is a member of the internal security forces and is fighting alongside the regime forces against the armed opposition forces in Dara'a.

On the other hand, the family of the young Palestinian Ahmed Jihad Ibrahim from Diabia in Damascus countryside appealed to the international and local organizations and institutions and anyone who may have information, to help find their son and to know his fate and his whereabouts. The 18-year-old Mansour went missing in Zamlka in the Eastern Ghouta in 2013; no credible information as to his fate had been received since then.

The AGPS monitoring and documentation team recorded 323 missing Palestinian refugees, among whom 38 women, since the beginning of the Syrian war.

In Jordan, the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees (UNRWA) distributed on Thursday the first round of 2019 cash assistance to Palestinian refugees from Syria (PRS), from May 16, 2019 to May 25, 2019.

UNRWA had sent text messages to PRS in Jordan telling them to go only to any ATMs of Ahli Bank to withdraw 20.348 dinars, deposited to each member of the family for regular assistance and due for the first round of 2019, stressing the need to withdraw the full amount before 25/05/2019.
