"The Syrian Security Raids Al Aedein Camp in Homs and the Continuous Arrest Hunts the Residents"



- A PLA Officer Dies in Medaa area in Damascus Suburb
- Residents of Husseneia Camp Complain of Poor Infrastructure
- 70% of Buildings at Deraa, Handarat, and Sbeina Camp are Destroyed, and 40% of Buildings in Yarmouk are Affected

Victims

The Palestinian refugee "Mohammed Jassim Hussein," a PLA officer, died while fighting alongside the regime forces in Medaa town East Ghouta in Damascus suburb. He is from Al Wafedein camp in Damascus suburb. His father was one of the cadres of the pro-Syrian regime PFGC.



Recent Updates

Residents of Al Aedein camp in Homs are suffering from large harassments practiced by members of the Syrian security detachment who is implementing campaigns of arrest, inspection, and check of the identities of passers-by. Members of the detachment are also imposing royalties, which forced residents to migrate out of the country, noting that the AGPS documented 186 Palestinian prisoners from Al Aedein camp in the Syrian regime's prisons.

The AGPS correspondent reported that a patrol of the Syrian military security raided Al Aedein camp in Homs and arrested the young man, "Nezar Mohammed al-Lahham - Abu Mohammed." The patrol raided Abu Nezar Al Lahham butcher shop and then raided the family home and



the homes of his sons. The 4-floor- house was inspected, but the search and arrest were unsuccessful; the young man is in the fourth decade of life, from the city of Acre in Palestine.



In Damascus suburb, residents of Husseneia camp appealed all responsible for camp services to solve the drainage problems which worsened dramatically in recent times because of the failure of the provinces and municipalities to carry their duties. Residents of the camp are suffering from an accumulation of garbage and rubble that resulted from shelling in several streets of the camp, which has led to the spread of large numbers of rodents, which form a major threat to the lives of people, the spread of diseases, and increased the suffering

for the large number of rats to the accumulation and spread of garbage on the roads, in addition to the ruins of destroyed homes by shelling and the delay of municipal authorities concerned to remove them, creating "fertile" environment for the spread of rats, in their own words .

Husseneia camp had witnessed acts of bombing by MIG planes which killed many victims and resulted in considerable damage in homes, as happened in the massacre that targeted civilians in 17/01/2013 after bombardment by aircrafts. Violent fighting broke out between the regular army alongside the pro-regime groups and the armed opposition groups, before the regular army completely controlled the camp in 10/09/2013.

The Syrian regime continues to target Palestinian refugees camps scattered from north to south of country by planes, tanks, missiles, explosive barrels, and mortars, which resulted in massive destruction in homes and properties as well as the killing of thousands of victims and injuries among the Palestinian refugees.

Eye witnesses estimated that more than 70% of buildings in Deraa camp are completely destroyed by explosive barrels and the Syrian warplanes raids, which resulted in the migration of thousands of refugees who fled towards the neighboring areas or to outside Syria.

In the meantime, eye witnesses estimated that more than 80% of buildings in Sbeina camp are completely destroyed, especially the area that extends from Moa Bin Jabal mosque till the Kurds bakery, which is the western entrance of the camp.



In the south of Syria, eye witnesses estimated that more than 70% of buildings in Handarat camp are completely and partially destroyed due to the rockets and explosive barrels under the pretext of targeting the armed opposition groups.

In the Yarmouk refugee camp south of the capital Damascus, it is estimated that about 40% of the buildings are completely and partially damaged by the war machine, where witnesses confirms that the entrance of the camp is the worst affected areas being the confrontations between the Syrian regime and the armed opposition groups.

It should be noted that other Palestinian camps and compounds have been targeted with explosive barrels, artillery shells, and rockets, which left considerable damage in homes, in addition to casualties, including children and women.

Turning to Lebanon, where the Palestinians of Syria Committee participated in a workshop held on July 14th in Al-Nabea Assembly at Ain al-Hilweh refugee camp in Sidon, southern Lebanon; the workshop was about the protection of the camp's children.

Participants in the workshop discussed some issues related to the problems faced by the children of Ein Hilweh refugee camp and the Palestinian children displaced from Syria to the camp, as they also talked about the social, health and ethical problems and the ways and mechanisms to address them .

It is noteworthy that the number of Palestinian Syrian families inside the Ain al-Hilweh refugee camp is 1400 families out of about 12 thousand

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 17\07\2016:

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan*
- *42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon*
- *6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015*
- *8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey*
- *1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza*
- *More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1125 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1187 days, water was cut for 676 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 979 days respectively.*

- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1 171 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 832 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
