### ***Victims***

*Palestinian refugee Osama Abu Sitta, ISIS's former Emir (prince), died in onslaughts launched by the International Coalition Forces on ISIS sites in AlRiqa stronghold.*

*Abu Sitta left Yarmouk Camp following a deal struck between ISIS and the Syrian government.*

### ***Latest Developments***

*Reporting from southern Damascus, AGPS news correspondent said tension has soared in blockaded Yarmouk Camp after ISIS unraveled an illicit antiquities trade network and a fake currency printer.*

*A manhunt was launched by ISIS against affiliated lawbreakers involved in such felonies, most of whom reportedly ISIS leaders.*



*ISIS has seized large parts of Yarmouk Camp. At the same time clashes have been ongoing between ISIS and Tahrir AlSham battalion in the camp since April 6, 2016.*



*In another development, activists and civilians in Yarmouk called for a “march of anger” on Friday, July 21, in Yalda, south of Damascus, in protest at the simmering Israeli aggressions on AlAqsa Mosque and Occupied Jerusalem.*

*Meanwhile, UNRWA is expected to distribute the third batch of cash assistance to the Palestinians of Syria as of July 23, 2017. The distribution process is to be wrapped up on September 14, 2017.*

*In a statement on Facebook, UNRWA said every family member registered with the agency as part of the normal cases list will receive a sum of 33,000 Syrian Pounds. Those taking cover in UNRWA shelters will receive 16,000 Syrian Pounds.*

*According to the agency, families who received aids in the previous assistance round will be systematically put on the present lists.*

*Every person aged 18 or above and registered with UNRWA can receive aids on behalf of his/her family members on condition that he/she shows the UNRWA-marked registration card.*

*UNRWA called on the families who did not receive their second-batch aids and those who obtained registration cards for the first time to show up at the agency’s information offices and file complaints as of July 25, 2017 until August 8, 2017.*

*UNRWA recommended that family members with disputed eligibility do not receive aids until their situation is worked out. The agency pledged to send text messages to concerned persons as soon as the issue is resolved and final lists settled.*



*Text messages delineating the time and place of distribution, slated to last for six weeks, will be sent to the concerned family members ahead of time. Residents of Tarotous will receive their aids via AlBaraka Bank.*

*Some 450,000 Palestinians have been taking shelter in war-ravaged Syria, 280 among whom have become internally displaced, according to UNRWA statistics until December 2016.*

### ***Civil Action***

*The Palestine Charity Commission embarked on a project to dig up an artesian water well of a depth of 250 meters in Khan Dannun Camp, in Rif Dimashq.*

*The project aims to assuage the upshots of the war crisis wrought on Khan Dannun, where civilians have been forced to purchase costly tank water.*





***Palestinians of Syria: July 17, 2017 Statistics:***

- *At least 3,526 Palestinians, including 463 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,615 Palestinian refugees, including 101 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,454 days in a row.*
- *196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,190 and 1,039 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,534 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 268 days.*
- *Nearly 85,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria fled to Europe until the end of 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
