Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria

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“Violent Night Clashes and Three Building Exploded at Alrija Square in the Yarmouk Camp”

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Victims

The young man Hasan Ali Saqer, known as Abu Ali, from Sbeina camp and displaced in Khan Dannon camp, died during participating the ongoing war in Syria, Raising the toll of Sbeina camp victims to 67 refugees, according to the AGPS statistics.



Activists confirm that the pro-regime armed groups recruited many young Palestinian refugees in exchange for money, taking advantage of the tragic living conditions such as, poverty, spread of unemployment, and lack of financial resources. The young Palestinians have been sent to the battle fronts against the armed opposition groups, under the pretext of protection the Palestinian camps.

Recent Updates

Violent clashes broke out the day before yesterday at the axes of the Yarmouk camp with light and medium weapons in conjunction with the fall of nearly 6 shells in different parts of the camp, resulting in the



destruction of houses, while the besieged residents heard sound of explosions from Rija area.

General Command has announced via Facebook the bombing of three buildings in Rija square, said that opposition groups militants holed up in, and the operation came in order to expand the security cordon around the capital.

This comes in light of the continuation of the siege imposed by the regular army and PFGC groups for 838 days respectively, power outages for more than (908) days, and water for 398 days.



Meanwhile, the Syrian security prevent the introduction of medical equipment, medicine, and specialized staff, as well as prevent the return of people, in addition to the control of ISIS and Al-Nusra on the Yarmouk refugee camp since the beginning of last April.

On the other hand, the Palestinian Syrian female journalist, Samah Abu Baker, who resorted to France a year ago, is living under the threat of expulsion from her house.

According to media sources, Samah had been arrested from the Syrian regime's TV building because of the bias of the revolution, saying that she traveled after leaving the prison to Lebanon.



The sources said, quoting Samah, that after more than 6 months in Lebanon, she communicated with "Naseem Center" and "French Lebanese Center for Human Rights" and was able to secure asylum in France in cooperation with "Samir Kassir Foundation to Protect Press Freedoms."

However, she found herself suddenly threatened to be thrown in the street by the (Kada) organization which pledged to secure housing since the beginning of the asylum but abandoned, forcing her to sit in front of "Aloovira," the body responsible for giving the refugees the right of asylum in France.

According to Samah's conversation with a website, (Alcada) had communicated with them on Monday, October 12 telling her of the need to attend to interview with the Director of (Alcada) in order to receive her file and end her association with the organization and assured her not to secure housing."

(Alcada) dealt with her with a kind of repression and psychological pressure, pointing out that when she objected and told them that France



sent her visa, the social assistance denied and claimed that France did not elicit any refugees into its territory and even told her loud and clear: "If you do not like France you can change the country of asylum."

The journalist hopes to receive new solutions, during the second interview, which has been invited by the organization.

In another context, the BBC TV reported, by Turkish officials, that they confirm that the action plan approved by the officials from the European Union to work together with Turkey to curb the flow of migrants to Europe, is still just a draft has not been approved.

The plan was to accelerate the Turks exemption from the EU visa if Turkey limited the flow of migrants to Europe.

According to the BBC, the Turkish Foreign Minister Feridun Sinarla Ihsanoglu said that the agreement is still just a draft, describing the proposed financial measures by the European Union as "unacceptable."

The European Union agreed on a work plan with Turkey will hopefully help to reduce the flow of migrants to Europe.

About 600,000 immigrants have arrived to Europe by sea this year, most of them traveled via Turkey to Greece before they move north into Europe.

On the other hand, the Greek authorities investigate the collision of a Greek ship with migrants' boat, last Thursday, which killed 7 immigrants.

According to media sources, seven immigrants drowned, including infant and 3 children, after the sinking of their boat, last Thursday, a result of a collision with a ship belonging to the Greek coast guards, near the Greek



island of Lesbos, while sources pointed out that 31 immigrants were rescued.



Numbers and Statistics till 17/10/2015

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 838 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 908 days, water was cut for 398 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 182 victims.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 699 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 900 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*

- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 544 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.*
