Latest Developments

A Palestinian child from the Mahmoud Family, sheltered in Al-Neirab Camp, was left injured on Monday in an onslaught by the US-led international alliance on the Akrobat refugee community on the Turkish-Syrian borderland.

A state of panic swamped the Akrobat area, housing Syrian refugees displaced from northern Syria, along with Palestinian families displaced from Aleppo-based Handarat and Al-Neirab shelters.



Several refugees fled the area for fear that their children would be killed in such unabated onslaughts.

In another development, the General Authority for Palestine Refugees on Wednesday put into effect Resolution No. 46, which was issued on December 18, 2016, to form a local committee to administer Yarmouk affairs, previously run the local council.



The committee is expected to manage the affairs of Palestinian refugee camps in Syria in line with the idiosyncrasy of the socio-political situation.

The newly-appointed nine-member team includes a chairman, a secretariat, a relief office, an education office, an activities department, a services bureau, a statistics and documentation bureau, an information office, and a financial department.

Meanwhile, UNRWA transferred cash aids for the Palestinians of Syria in Lebanon via ATM cards.

Every Palestinian family from Syria received a rental allowance of up to \$100 and a food allowance worth 27\$ per every refugee.

UNRWA further delivered UNICEF-funded winter cash assistance for Palestinian children from Syria. Every child aged 18 or below would receive 60,000 Syrian Liras as a winter grant.

In December 2016, UNRWA provided Palestinian-Syrian families in Lebanon sheltered in areas higher than 500 meters above sea level with \$588, covering the four installments pledged by the agency. Those sheltered in areas lower than 500 meters above sea level received \$400.

At the same time, the Committee of the Palestinians of Syria in Lebanon, in partnership with the Quds Charity Committee, delivered winter clothes to displaced Palestinian-Syrian families taking refuge in Al-Badawi Camp, in the northern Lebanese city of Tripoli.



Toddler diapers were also handed out to 50 displaced families as part of underway endeavors to assuage the calamitous state of affairs endured by the Palestinians from Syria.



Palestinians of Syria: January 18, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,421 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,146 Palestinian refugees, including 81 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,309 days in a row.*
- *190 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,013 and 826 days.*

- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,356 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 90 days.*
- *Government troops ban residents of Al-Sbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,162 days running.*
- *Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
