Recent Updates

The Regular Army artillery stationed at Talat Al Kabouseya area targeted houses and lanes at Khan Al Shieh camp and resulted in only material damages.

Meanwhile, violent clashes broke out between groups of the Syrian armed opposition and the Regular Army several days ago, which resulted in significant deterioration of living conditions as a result of the deteriorated security situation in the adjacent areas, in addition to shelling.



The AGPS correspondent reported that the residents are suffering of dire humanitarian conditions as a result of the closure of all roads leading to Khan Al Shieh area, the prevention of food, medication, and bread entry, as well as the continuous cut of power and communication for long periods.

Residents of Khan Al Shieh camp launched appeals to the concerned parties to urgently allow the entry of food and medical aid, bread, fuel



needed for generators, extraction of water from wells, and to make efforts to stop targeting the camp and to neutralize it from the ongoing clashes.

More than 15,000 Palestinian refugees and a number of Palestinian Syrian families, who were displaced from other conflict areas, are living in a miserable condition due to the stifling siege in addition to the frequent shelling, especially following the intensification of fighting at the north western Front of Khan Al Shieh (Almansheia -Hussenieat Khan Al Shieh) which were targeted with explosive barrels recently. On the other hand, violent clashes and mutual sniping broke out in the Yarmouk camp south of Damascus between ISIS and Nusra, while a resident confirmed that Nusra has controlled the lane opposite to "Alfatira Al Shakhina" pastry shop beside Loubeia Street, connecting the Yarmouk main Street with Haifa Street.

ISIS groups attacked groups of Nusra at the beginning of April 2016, after the latter supported ISIS to break into the Yarmouk camp at the beginning of April 2015. Residents of Khan Dannon camp in Damascus suburb are suffering from bread crisis, which resulted from decreasing the flour quantities provided for bakeries.





Hundreds of families gather daily for long hours in front of the bakery in order to have a bread pack, yet they complain of its poor quality, as the bread contains insects inside such as worms.

Furthermore, residents have demanded the Syrian government and the concerned authorities to provide bread material "because they need them and cannot be dispensed with, or replaced with another substance," as they demanded to increase flour allocations of bakeries, and to hold accountable bakeries' owners who only care for profit.

Residents of Khan Danno also suffer from domestic gas crisis, in addition to power outages for long hours up to more than 16 hours a day.

Living and health conditions in Deraa camp southern Syria continues to deteriorate, following the bombings and frequent clashes since the beginning of the war, causing destruction of approximately 70% of its buildings, according to unofficial statistics, while the remaining refugees live in very serious humanitarian situation, especially health and living aspects.

Meanwhile, Egyptian authorities prevented the Palestinian Syrian businessman "Ghassan al-Hassan," Assistant Secretary-General of the Arab professional union for workers in the construction and timber and making construction materials, from entering the country to participate in the conference called for by the General Union of Egyptian Workers, because he holds the Palestinian Syrian passport.





He posted on his Facebook page that the airport authorities told him that the Palestinian Syrian travel document must have a security approval enables him to enter Egyptian territory. He added that he had asked the airport security agents to treat him gently and to let him make a phone call to bear the owners responsibility for what he suffered, but they refused. They detained him in the Department of immigration at the airport and prevented him from communicating, and canceled all his travel reservations, and then they deported him to Beirut

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 18\05\2016:

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan*
- *42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon*
- *6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015*

- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 922 days respectively.*

- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 113 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 775 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
