

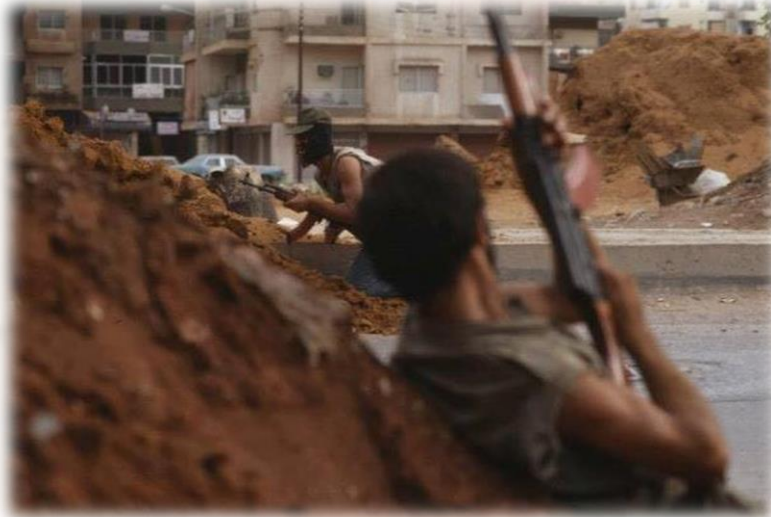

"Pro-Gov't Sources: Retreat of ISIS, AlNusra from Yarmouk Camp Deferred"

Latest Developments

Sources affiliated with the Syrian government said on Sunday that the retreat of ISIS and Tahrir AlSham fighters from Yarmouk was delayed due to security and military reasons.

Secretary of the Alliance of Palestinian Forces in Syria, Khaled Abdul Majid, said preparations will be ongoing to ensure the retreat of ISIS fighters to the right place and at the right time.

He added that AlNusra fighters in Yarmouk, Beit Sahem, Yalda, and Babila will leave the camp in the near future as part of the four-town agreement which stipulates that wounded and sick people along with a number of families be allowed access out of Kafriya and AlFou'a.

According to Abdul Majid, the list includes 130 combatants from AlNusra in Yarmouk and 2,000 from ISIS in Yarmouk and AlHajar AlAswad.

Abdul Majid added that half of ISIS militants agreed to work out their situation and remain in AlHajar AlAswad. The rest of combatants will retreat from AlHajar AlAswad and Yarmouk.

Activists said buses have been spotted near the main entrances to the camp, paving the way for the sudden retreat of AlNusra militias and the takeover of the Syrian government troops and their partners.

In a related development, Dara' AlAqsa Forces—the military wing of the Free Palestine Movement—announced that one of its members—Abdullah Hasan—sustained wounds in the clashes that flared up in the camp at predawn on Sunday. AlHasan was rushed to a hospital and is in a stable condition.



Reporting from Yarmouk, AGPS news correspondent said fierce clashes burst out at AlShuhadaa crossroads, in Yarmouk, between Dara' AlAqsa and the pro-government troops, on the one hand, and ISIS and AlKara'in, on the other. Injuries were reported on both sides.



Meanwhile, Palestinian refugees from Syria in the besieged Gaza Strip appealed to UNRWA to provide them with much-needed financial allowances.

The refugees' follow-up committee urged the senior advisor of UNRWA's executive office Hakam Shahwan to immediately step in and work on alleviating the crises endured by several families who have been displaced from their homes due to the soaring rental fees.

The committee held UNRWA office in Syria responsible for delays in the disbursement of the refugees' financial aids and called for the implementation of a permanent aid mechanism.

176 Palestinian-Syrian families in the blockaded Gaza Strip have been enduring dire living conditions due to the decade-long Israeli siege and



the devastating upshots of the latest Israeli offensive on the coastal enclave.

The Palestinians of Syria in Gaza attributed the crisis to the apathy maintained by the human rights institutions, most notably UNRWA, and the official authorities, namely the national consensus government and the Palestine Liberation Organization.



In another development, the Palestine Charity Commission embarked on a campaign to amass Zakat funds (alms-giving) to the war-affected families in Palestinian refugee camps and communities.

According to the campaigners, the move makes part of underway endeavors to rally round Palestinian families in war-ravaged Syria, particularly in AlTel, AlHusseiniya Camp, AlZahira, Jaramana Camp, Khirbet AlShiyab, Daraa Camp, Qudsaya, AlRamadan Camp, Palestinians of Iraq, AlAydeen Camp in Homs and Hama, and AlNeirab Camp in Aleppo.



Palestinians of Syria: June 18, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,521 Palestinians, including 463 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,608 Palestinian refugees, including 100 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,425 days in a row.*
- *196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,161 and 1,012 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,505 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 239 days.*
