Victims

The Palestinian refugee, Yasser Mahmoud Shoaib, died after his car was targeted by a mortar shell while returning from his work in the city of Aleppo, noting that he is a resident of Aleppo and worked as a driver in the UNRWA.



It should be noted that a number of UNRWA staff members were killed in Syria due to the targeting of their headquarters in the Palestinian refugee camps in Syria.

The Palestinian Syrian child, Hossam Mohammed Tanji died in Sidon governmental hospital in Lebanon after suffering of a complete coma and transferred to intensive care in the hospital. He died because his family was not able to provide the necessary money for treatment.

The child "Mohammed Tanji" was displaced with his family from the Yarmouk refugee camp to the city of Sidon in southern Lebanon, where he suffered throughout four years of bad health condition that began to decline a year ago. After several attempts to secure the needed

medication, despite the high cost, and after the lack of response for many appeals, his family became no longer able to secure the money.



Recent Updates

Hussein Falah, Imam of a mosque and one of the dignitaries of Khan AL Shieh camp, was exposed yesterday morning to a failed assassination attempt after warplanes targeted his house. The shelling resulted in damage of properties and a state of panic among civilians, especially children. Falah has not any political or military activities, however, activists believe that the Syrian Regime is practicing a plan for the assassination of public figures and dignitaries in Khan Al Shieh camp, as well as harassment of civilians and continued bombardment.

The AGPS correspondent reported that Russian and Syrian warplanes launched several raids on the western and eastern outskirts of Khan Al Shieh camp, which resulted in one injury as a result of shrapnel that reached homes of civilians, and led to the destruction of a civilian car.

This comes amid continuous areal shelling that targets the camp and the adjacent farms in a daily basis, coinciding with the closure of all roads linking the camp with the center of the capital Damascus.

The AGPS documented 117 victims who died since the beginning of war events in Syria.



In the south of the capital Damascus, violent clashes broke out on Monday night in Yarmouk, especially the Yarmouk municipality area at Palestine Street, Al Mahkama area, and Al Rija square, where medium and heavy weapons were used.

Violent clashes also broke out between the armed opposition groups and the pro-regime groups at Nisreen Street "National Defense" near Alameen bakery and the vicinity of Aliskan buildings at altadamon neighborhood adjacent to Yarmouk.

Meanwhile, besieged and displaced people of the Yarmouk camp are still suffering due to the ongoing conflict inside the camp, in addition to the restrictions of ISIS against the besieged residents inside the clashes area. They are also suffer due to the siege imposed by the Regular Army and the GC groups for 1127 consecutive days, power cut for more than 1188 days, and water cut for 677 days respectively.

The Syrian regime prevents the entry of food and medical aid, in addition to the return of residents to their homes.

In the meantime, the AGPS correspondent in Aleppo reported that a state of panic prevailed Nairab camp due to the heavy explosions that came out from Nairab airport, which is controlled by the Syrian regime.

Our correspondent confirmed that houses of the camp were shaking due to the explosions that broke out in the Syrian regime and defense plants, about 7 km from the camp.

The Nairab military airport adjacent to the camp in a sensitive and important point for the conflict parties in Syria, where it was subjected to shelling and shooting by the opposition groups, resulting in casualties and injuries among civilians.

It is noteworthy that the AGPS documented 142 victims among the Palestinian refugees at Neirab camp, who died since the start of war events there.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 18\07\2016:

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015
- 8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey
- 1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza
- More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015
- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1126 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1188 days, water was cut for 677 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.
- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 980 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about 1 172 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 833 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
