Statistical Report

The AGPS issued a documentary report titled "Statistics of the Palestinian victims till the end of September 2015. The report documents 3031 Palestinian Syrian refugee victims who have died for direct reasons such as shelling, clashes, torture in detention centers, explosions, and siege, and indirect causes such as sinking during attempts to reach Europe via what has become known as the "death boats".

The report indicates that 1688 victims were distributed on all Palestinian refugee camps in Syria, Daraa in the south, passing through Khan Dannon, Khan Al Shieh, Sayeda Zeinab, Yarmouk, Jaramana, Sbeineh, Husseini, Al Aedein in Homs, Al Aedein in Hama, Al Raml, Hndaratand Neirab in the north, in addition to 1274 victims died outside camps in various Syrian cities, in addition to 69 others died outside Syria.



The report also documents 69 victims in Yarmouk died after ISIS stormed the camp since the beginning of April 2015.

The AGPS pointed out that its report concerns of documenting the statistics of the Palestinian victims in Syria since the beginning of events until the end of September 2015, and it is not interested identifying the actual doer.

Recent Updates

Syrian warplanes targeted the adjacent farms of Khan Al Shieh camp, yesterday, with at least two explosive barrels; sounds of explosions were clearly heard inside the camp.



Checkpoints of the regular army are still close all roads linking the camp and the center of the capital, Damascus, forcing residents to take the dangerous road of Zakya-Khan Al Shieh to get to Damascus, where it is frequently targeted with missiles and heavy machine guns.

In the south of Syria, residents of Muzeireeb town, which inhabited with about 8,500 Palestinian refugees, are still living in a state of tension and chaos because of continued shelling with explosive barrels, which resulted in a number of victims and injuries, as well as massive destruction of buildings and property.

Residents are also suffering from dire living conditions, where they complain of widespread unemployment, high cost of food and fuel, and continued power outages and communication for long periods.



In the south of Damascus, the regular army checkpoints allowed the entry of the Palestinian students who came out of the Yarmouk camp two days ago to perform general information test, where the General Authority for Palestinian Arab Refugees assumed responsibility to exit student and bring them back to the camp.

A state of relative calm prevailed fighting lines at the Yarmouk camp after the violent clashes that broke out in the past two days, which resulted in the control of Al-NusraFront to a new sector that were under the control of the regular army and PFGC groups.





Detainees

The Syrian security services continue detaining many Palestinian families and reticent on their fate, such as the family of Mawloud Khaled Al-Abdullah, where members of the Syrian regime arrested the entire family on 07.27.2013 at the regime's checkpoint in Nesreen Street in the adjacent neighborhood of Al Tadamon.

The family members are:

Father "Mawloud Khaled Al-Abdullah" 73-year-old, heart patient

Mother" Thiba Al-Ahmad "65 years, diabetes patient

Ilham Mawloud al-Abdullah, 48 years, Enam Mawloud al-Abdullah 33 years, Jasmine Mawloud al-Abdullah, 39 years, and her son Ubada Abdullah 6 years.

Unconfirmed news reported that the families that have been arrest from Al Tadamon neighborhood are held by one of the Syrian regime popular Committees; other news reported that they are held in a Syrian security branch in Damascus, while the fate of those families are not known yet.

It is noteworthy that the AGPS documented 988 Palestinian prisoners in the prisons of the Syrian regime, including 61 female detainees, while the toll of torture victims has reached 423 refugees



Numbers and Statistics till 18/10/2015

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 839 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 909 days, water was cut for 399 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 182 victims.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 700 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 901 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 545 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.*
