"Fears of Increasing the Number of Torture Victims in the Syrian Prisons"



Mohammed Fayyad, died due to torture in the prisons of the Syrian regime

- A Palestinian Refugee Corpse was Identified within the Leaked Pictures of the Torture Victims in the Syrian Prisons
- Shelling is the First Reason that led to the Death of the Palestinians of Syria then Clashes and Torture

Victims

The Palestinian refugee "Mohammed Fayyad," a resident of the Yarmouk Camp died due to torture in the prisons of the Syrian regime, where activists confirmed to the group that his body was identified by his family through the leaked images of the victims of enforced disappearances in the security branches of the Syrian regime.

Raising the total toll of the torture victims who were identified through the photos that were leaked by a dissident officers for the Syrian regime to (35) victims.

Recent Updates

During the past few days, there was a remarkable increase in the numbers of victims of torture of Palestinian refugees who are detained in the Syrian prisons, where during the last five days, (35) pictures of Palestinian Refugees' bodies were identified who died due to torture, where the signs of torture were clearly appear on most of those images that ranged from severe beatings, eyes poke, and skull fracture, while the signs of hunger and drought seemed clear on those pictures. It is noteworthy that these images are part of one of the thousands of pictures of defectors from the Syrian regime slipped to human rights organizations.

For its part, the AGPS expressed its deep concern and fear of the possibility of increasing the number of victims of Palestinian refugees in the Syrian prisons, especially as the AGPS documented the information of hundreds of detainees, who are amounted to (791) Palestinian male and female refugees.

In a related context, the documented statistics on the AGPS website "actionpal.org.uk" indicated that the bombing is the first reason that led to the death of (989) Palestinian refugee victims in Syria. Meanwhile, the armed clashes were the second reason that caused the death of (563) victims, as the torture to death in Syrian jails comes in third place where the AGPS documented the names of (323) Palestinians refugees died under torture in the prisons of the Syrian regime.



It is noteworthy that the total number of Palestinian victims, who were documented by the AGPS, has reached (2713) victims were documented by name, place and cause of death.

The AGPS issued yesterday a report entitled "The Palestinian Refugee, the Represented Yet Neglected", which referred to the failure of the Arab and Western media in addressing the issues and the suffering of the Palestinian Syrian refugees, especially through media coverage, which coincided with the four years after the war in Syria.

On the other hand, it is now 337 days of water cut in Daraa camp for Palestinian refugees South of Syria and in the Yarmouk refugee camp (190) days respectively, where people were forced to use artesian wells to try to secure some water for their children despite those waters are pollutants, but it is the only option left to them. The people are suffering of great difficulties in extracting those waters because of the continuing power cut from the two camps, in addition to the scarcity of fuel needed to operate electric generators to provide power for the pull engines, prompting some people to use hand pumps to overcome that problem.

Turning to Damascus suburb, the people of Khan Dannon camp suffer of multiple living crises highlighted in the absence of relief aid, and the prevalence of unemployment among people, in light of the high cost of living and rents homes after the displacement of hundreds of families from the nearby Palestinian refugee camps because of the shelling, clashes, and siege during the past few months. The AGPS monitoring and documentation team confirmed that they documented information about (28) Palestinian refugees died in Khan Dannun over the past years.

The Syrian security forces released the Palestinian refugee "Suleiman Falah" from Khan Al Shieh camp after being arrested for one day in a checkpoint of the security forces. As well as all the roads connecting between the camp and the surrounding areas still closed except for (Zakia - Khan Al Shieh), forcing the people to use it in spite of the risks that may face them through that route.

In Aleppo, a group of Al-Quds Brigade affiliated to the regular army arrested the Palestinian refugee "Ayman Dahoudi" from Al Nairab camp due to his refusal to vacate his shop, which is located in the building of the young man "Obada Dahoudi" who died several days ago on the front of Handarat.

It is noteworthy that the members of the Palestinian al-Quds Brigade and the regular army have seized a number of expatriates houses inside the camp and those who participated in the fighting alongside with the armed forces affiliated to the Syrian opposition.

Numbers and Statistics till 18/3/2015

- *At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 620 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 700 days, water was cut for 190 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 172 victims.*
- *80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51,300 in*

Lebanon and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.

- *Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 522days respectively.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 491 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 693 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 337 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
