



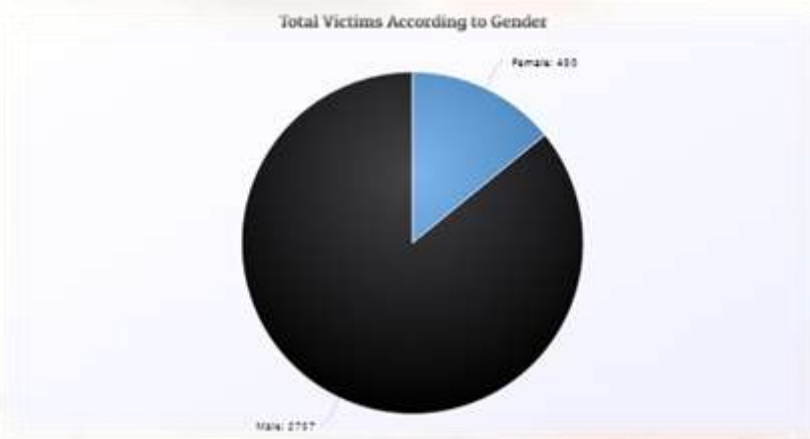

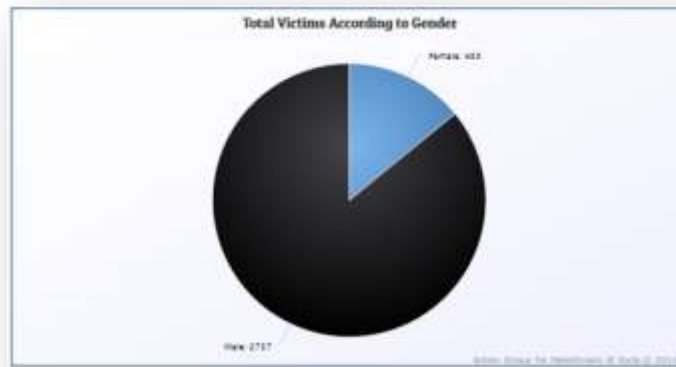

RECENT UPDATES

On the eve of Mother's Day, the AGPS assures that its monitoring and documentation team managed to document 446 Palestinian woman killed in Syria due to the war, as well as 75 women arrested and still unaccounted for until now.



The AGPS says these numbers are very likely to increase significantly since there are lots of difficulties in gathering information about all similar cases in light of families' fears of talking and the regime's secrecy on this regard.

The AGPS demands the international community and all human rights institution to put more pressure on the Syrian regime to serve accelerating their release.

Also, calls for all the Palestinian institutions and parties to prioritize this issue and use the needed means to get it solved.

In a different topic, the Syrian regime's forces targeted, the day before yesterday, a civilians' car near Khan Eshieh camp causing death to the Syrian child "Anas Al-Shaikh", and injuries to four at least.

It is noteworthy that the camp's outskirts have been hit by 16 explosive barrels recently by regime's warplanes.

To Damascus countryside, Al-Yarmouk camp's Services Office, in cooperation with the local council and the Civil Defense performed pesticide spraying campaign in Al-Yarmouk's streets.



The campaign comes after the abundance spread of insects, and will continue for three days, according to the officials.

In a related context, Jafra foundation, as part of the Rajien3 Project, distributed food parcels to people of Al-Yarmouk camp who had been displaced to Yalda nearby town.

The distribution was performed depending on the census conducted by the Relief Committee in the region.

Meanwhile, hundreds of activists around the world, from London, Paris, Berlin, Beirut, Singapore and San Francisco performed, at the same time, electronic demonstrations demanding to reveal the fate of the Palestinian Syrian software programmer Basil Khartabil who is still prisoned in Syrian regime's jails.

The demonstrators launched the English hashtag #WhereIsBassel, raised photos and slogans demand to release him.

The military investigations had arrested Khartabil on 15 March 2012, detained him for eight months before transferring him to Adra prison in December 2012. During this time, Khartabil was exposed to various



kinds of torture and maltreatment, stayed in Adra prison until 3 October 2015 when he managed to deliver a message to his family telling them that he will be transported again to unknown destination. His family expressed its deep concerns about his safety, assuring, at the same time, they have never heard about him since then.



Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 20 March 2016

- *15,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan,*
- *6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command), continued for 1009 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 1070 days, water cut for 558 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 186 victims.*

- *Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 865 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1056 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 719 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.*
- *Jarmana, AL-Saieda Zainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and Al-AedeinHama: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al-Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.*
