Victims

The young man, Ahmed Asaad Alsayed, a fighter of the so-called the pro-Syrian regime Palestinian movement of Shabab Al Awda Movemen, died during battles in the city of Raqqa northeast Syria at the airport of Al Tabaga area, while four members were injured. Meanwhile, the armed wing of the movement, "the Galilee Palestinian forces," mourned two of its elements in Deir ez-Zor several days ago.

It is noteworthy that a number of Palestinian factions formed armed groups fighting alongside the Syrian regime, distributed in and around some Palestinian refugee camps and is involved in some cases in support battles of the regular army.

Recent Updates

In World Refugee Day, the AGPS documented "3263" Palestinian refugees have died during the ongoing war in Syria. Statistics of the AGPS noted that "1081" refugees died after their houses bombed, while "719" refugees died due to clashes, "447" refugees died under torture in the Syrian regime's prisons, and "293" refugees have been shot by a sniper.



"187" refugees died because of the strict siege imposed by the regime and PFGC



groups over the Yarmouk refugee camp, while the rest of victims died due to various reasons, including field executions, bombings, kidnappings, and other reasons.

The monitoring and documentation team of the AGPS documented data of "1077" Palestinian Syrian detainees who are detained in prisons of the Syrian regime, noting that the real number may exceed 1200 detainees, because of the fear of many families of detainees to tell about the disappearance of their children in the regime's prisons.

During the last years of the Syrian war, a huge wave of mass migration was observed inside and outside Syria, where the number of Palestinian immigrants to Europe amounted to about 71 thousand, according to the AGPS statistics. The migrants were distributed across six core countries (Sweden, Germany, Netherlands, Austria, Norway, Denmark, about (15,500) Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, (42,500) Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, (6000) Palestinian Syrian refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics up to July 2015, (8000) Palestinian Syrian refugees in Turkey , and (1000) Palestinian Syrian refugees in the Gaza Strip.

About 280 thousand Palestinians were displaced inside Syria, most notably the Yarmouk refugee camp south of the capital, Damascus, in addition to Handarat camp in Aleppo and Deraa camp in southern Syria.



On the other hand, dozens of Palestinian students, who came out of the Yarmouk refugee camp to perform the high school exams of 2016, returned back, where they left the camp despite the blockade and the ongoing clashes between ISIS and Nusra.



Students who came out of their besieged camps (Yarmouk south of Damascus - Khan Al Shieh camp in the western suburb of Damascus,) to perform the high school examinations in Syria, have complained of negligence and carelessness regarding their interim living status in the "Alliance" center of the capital Damascus, which is supervised by UNRWA.

It is noteworthy that the conflict in Syria continues to affect directly on the education process of Palestinian refugees living in Syria. The Syrian conflict reduced dramatically from the youth and children opportunities to get an education, and the fear of most students from leaving the camp to deliver their exams (if they were allowed). Arrest and assassination are the leading obstacles that hinder the movement of education for young people in the Yarmouk camp.



The Palestinian refugee "Jamal Ahmed Musa, a fighter of the pro-Syrian regime" al-Quds Brigade," was released in an exchange of prisoners between the brigade and the armed opposition groups across Alqasr orchard in Aleppo. He is from Neirab in Aleppo, noting that al-Quds Brigade had earlier announced his death during Handarat camp battles via Facebook.

It is noteworthy that residents of Neirab in Aleppo have warned earlier that the actions of the pro-Syrian groups in the camp would immerse it directly in the conflict.



Lebanon

The 18-year-Palestinian Syrian refugee, "Ahmed Farooq Juma," from the Yarmouk refugee camp, was lost three days ago, while coming out of Burj Barajneh to Annan Road adjacent to the camp from the eastern side. No information or news received so far about him.

His family appealed the PLO, the Palestinian factions in Lebanon, and the Lebanese authorities to search for their son and to reveal his fate, knowing that his father is blind and he is the provider for his family.



Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 19\06\2016:

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan*
- *42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon*
- *6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015*
- *8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey*
- *1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza*
- *More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1100 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1161 days, water was cut for 651 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 954 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1 145 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*

- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 806 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
