"9 PLA Fighters Killed while Fighting Alongside Syrian Gov' Forces in Rif Dimashq"

Latest Developments

Nine fighters from the Palestine Liberation Army (PLA) were pronounced dead on July 19 as they fought alongside the Syrian regime army in clashes with the opposition outfits in AlReihan ranches, in Eastern AlGhouta, in Rif Dimashq, PLA announced on Facebook.

The nine casualties are identified as: Mohamed Khaled Hasan, Mahmoud Khaled Hasan, Yahya Mufeed Hussain, Ibrahim Hussain Mohsin, Ahmad Basam Hasan, Kifah Mohamed Hasan, Haitham Ismail Kasem, Mohamed Kheir Mustafa Sweid, and Mohamed Ahmad Ayedi.

According to AGPS data, 213 PLA fighters, among 6,000 conscripts, were killed in Rif Dimashq hostilities.

PLA is engaged in battles at over 15 flashpoints across war-ravaged Syria.



Meanwhile, reporting from southern Damascus, AGPS news reporter said tension has been running high in and around Yarmouk Camp following the manhunt launched by ISIS against crooked affiliates.



Internal rifts have also reached a zenith among ISIS leaders in Yarmouk and AlHajar AlAswad. Reports have emerged on the dismissal of the so-called ISIS Emir (prince) Abu Hisham AlKhabouri.

ISIS has been holding sway over large tracts of Yarmouk Camp. At the same time, clashes have been soaring between ISIS and Tahrir AlSham since April 6, 2016.

In another development, anonymous assailants came down heavily on the Palestinian refugee Abu Ahmad AlTalawi in Khan Dannun Camp, in Rif Dimashq. AlTalawi fell in a faint after he was stabbed and beaten in his head.



Activists held Khan Dannun's security forces responsible for the assault, accusing them of giving a green light to criminals, thieves, and lawbreakers in the camp.

Residents of Khan Dannun Camp, controlled by the Syrian government troops, have been enduring abject living conditions due to the lack of basic services, price upsurge, and chronic power and water blackouts.



Meanwhile, a rally was staged by Palestinian refugees and activists in Yalda town on Thursday, at the request of Jafra Foundation for Relief and Youth Development, to protest the Israeli aggressions at holy AlAqsa Mosque.

The rally-goers lauded the Palestinians of Occupied Jerusalem and Muslim sit-inners for standing their ground in the face of the Israeli sacrilegious schemes aiming to divide AlAqsa and wipe out the site's Islamic idiosyncrasy.

They further demanded an urgent intervention to push the Israeli occupation authorities to remove the metal detectors set around AlAqsa Mosque and lift the noose tightened around worshipers' neck.



Palestinians of Syria: July 20, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,527 Palestinians, including 463 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,615 Palestinian refugees, including 101 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*

- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,457 days in a row.*
- *196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,194 and 1,043 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,537 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 290 days.*
- *Nearly 85,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria fled to Europe until the end of 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
