“Libya Arrests 47 Palestinian Syrian Refugees... Al Rahman Mosque was burnt in Khan Al Sheih due to Bombing”



The detainees by the Libyan authorities

- The Action Group: - 22 victims from the residents of Al Aedin camp in Hama since the beginning of the Syrian events.
- The Yarmouk camp's houses are without water for 73 days.
- 220 days for the water cut and lack of basic services, in Dar'aa camp.
- 450 days for the prevention of Al Husayeneyya camp residents to return back to their houses by the Regular Army.

Libya

The Libyan authorities arrested 53 people of different nationalities, including 47 Palestinian Syrian refugees, during their trip to Europe which started from Sudan to Libya and it was supposed to end to Italy. According to a Libyan police officer, the refugees were detained in the Ijdabuya Police department in charges of illegal immigration till they take the legal procedures. In the same context, Mohammed Nedal Al Tayem, a Palestinian Syrian, was missed in Libya while he was trying to travel to Italy, No news till the moment. It is mentioned that the Libyan coasts became the destination of the Palestinians of Syria refugees and the Syrian refugees to reach Europe.

Statistics

The Action Group for Palestinians of Syria documented that the number of victims from Al Aedin camp residents in Hama, since the beginning of the Syrian events, is 22 victims, including 6 by snipers shot, 3 due to a car bomb, 2 due to torture, 2 were killed after being kidnapped, and a refugee was field executed.

Recent Updates

Khan Al Sheih camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus Suburb was exposed to bombing with a number of shells on separate places such as Al Rahman mosque which led to the burning of a mosque, where all the roads that connect the camp with the surrounding areas are still closed except for the Zakia road in Khan Al Sheih. In terms of living aspect, the residents complain of severe shortage of food, medical supplies and medical staff, in addition to the unavailability of fuel and its high prices, since the liter of fuel is 1.5 USD and the Gas Cylinder is 13 USD the Wood ton is about 250 USD.

In the Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees in the southern of Damascus, UNRWA distributed a limited quantity of food baskets on the besieged residents for a year and a half, where the residents are still suffering of the loss of life supplies due to the continuation of water cut for 73 days respectively, in addition to power and telecommunications cut



for more than a year and a half. They also suffer of the unavailability of medical equipments and materials which led to the death of 157 refugees due to the lack of nutrition and medical services.

Al Aedin camp in Homs witnessed an active movements, yesterday, but its residents are still suffering of the strict security procedures over the camp where it is besieged with three Regular Army checkpoints to control the entrances and exits. Most of the checkpoints are surrounded with great walls. The residents also complain of the arrest campaigns that the Syrian Security carries out once in a while against the residents of the camp which caused a state of fear and tension amongst its residents. The dignitaries of Al Sbeina camp continue to call and demand to return back to their houses and to avoid the pain of displacement, Diaspora, and the tight economic and living crises, especially after the control of the Regular Army on Al Sbeina area on 7/11/2013.

In Dar'aa camp, the water crisis continues for 220 days respectively amid the continuation of the medical and relief crises where the residents complain of the weakness of the relief work in the camp, UNRWA distributes its aids out of the camp which forces them to risk their lives in



order to get these aids in addition to the absence of the relief organizations in the camp. It is mentioned that 70% of the camp's buildings were destroyed due to the frequent bombing which prompted hundreds of families to leave the camp to the surrounding towns.

On the other hand, the residents of Al Husayneyya camp are still deprived to return back to their houses for 405 days after heavy battles between the Regular army alongside with Palestinian faction and the Syrian Opposition groups, the battles ended with full control of the Regular Army on the camp. The Regular Army checkpoints prevent people to return back without showing any causes which added more economic burdens on the residents especially with the high costs of rent houses and the spread of unemployment.

UNRWA

Zizette Darkazally, UNRWA Public Information Office in Lebanon, referred that the number of the Palestinian Syrian Refugees in Lebanon is 44000, according to UNRWA statistics. It is mentioned that the refugees are still recorded in the UNRWA offices in Syria.

Darkazally expressed her worry because of the inability of the Palestinian Syrian Refugees, who have the invalid residencies, to record their civil affairs such as marriage, death, new babies ...etc. According to UNRWA expectations, 1200 Palestinian Syrian children are born in Lebanon per year.

Mr. Pierre Krahenbuhl, UNRWA High Commissioner, said, during the UNRWA opening session for the consultations committee meetings, over 60% of the Palestine refugees are now displaced or have become refugees a second time over, in Lebanon or Jordan, in Turkey or in Egypt.

He noted that these countries are paying a great cost due to the regional instability, especially the ongoing events in Syria. Mr. Pierr continued, In Syria, 76 UNRWA schools – more than two-thirds – have become unusable. Most were damaged by the conflict or are now in areas too dangerous to reach. Fifteen of these are currently used as collective shelters, housing 6,106 people together as well as Damascus Training Centre and other UNRWA facilities. Schools engulfed in the fighting are



another dramatic example of the disregard for the sanctity of civilian life shown by parties to this conflict and it must be condemned.”

Turkey

The Turkish Relief organization IHH distributed a number of food baskets on some of the Palestinian Syrian families who are displaced in Antakya, Reyhanlı, Kirikhan and AlEslaheyya in Turkey. It is mentioned that the Palestinians of Syria committee of the FEDAR and IHH held a meeting and discussed the situation of the Palestinians of Syria refugees in Turkey and the ways of securing aids to alleviate their suffering and pain.

The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics till 20/11/2014

- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 503 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 586 days, water was cut for 73 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 157 victims.*
- *41 Palestinian refugees were killed outside of Syria.*
- *95 PLA members were killed due to Clashes in Syria.*

- **Al Husayneyya Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **405** days respectively.
- **Al Sbeina Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **374** days respectively.
- **Handarat Camp:** - Residents have left the camp for **574** days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- **Dara'a Camp:** - It is now almost **220** days without water and a complete absence of basic services.
- **Khan Al Sheih Camp:** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia road.
- **Khan Danoun Camp:** - Economic crisis is still continuing, specially unemployment and high prices.
- **Al Nairab Camp:** - Power is still cut for more than a year.
- **Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Ca mps in Homs and Hamma:** - A relatively quite situation in light of the economic crises.
