Turkey

Activists accused the Turkish military of violating international laws and norms to prohibit the deportation of anyone to a country where they would be at risk of serious human rights violations.

This comes a day after the Turkish army deported a group of Palestinian families to the Syrian territories under the pretext of entering the Turkish territory illegally, where they were detained for hours on the Turkish border, and then forced to return to Syria.

The rest of the detained families appealed the international and human rights organizations to intervene for not being deported to the Syrian territory for fear of arrest by the Syrian regime forces.

It is worth mentioning that this is not the first time for refugees to face violations at the hands of the Turkish army, while in many cases Turkish gendarmerie returned Palestinian refugees to Syria and shoot them.



It is noteworthy that thousands of Palestinian Syrian refugees fled events of war in Syria and entered Turkish territory illegally, due to the fact that the Turkish authorities do not give visa for the Palestinian Syrian



refugees, as they crossed to European countries illegally, while about 4,000 Palestinian refugees remained Inside Turkey, according to unofficial statistics.

In the same context, Turkish coast guards suspended yesterday 182 illegal immigrants, mostly from Syria, Afghanistan, off the coast of the town (Oewagek) in the state of Jnaq Castle (West), in the Aegean Sea, while trying to reach "Lesbos" Greek island, through inflatable boat .

Recent Updates

The regular army targeted Daraa Camp and Tareiq Al-sad neighborhood with Grad rockets, which resulted in number of victims and injuries among civilians, as well as massive destruction in houses.

Explosive barrels targeted Muzareeb town- Al Rai area linking between Muzareeb and Yadouda towns, which resulted in victims and injuries, and a state of panic in the ranks of the Palestinian refugees, especially



children and women, noting that Muzareeb town includes about 8,500 Palestinian refugees.

Thousands of Palestinian refugees from Daraa camp and Muzeireeb compound have fled the bombing to the neighboring countries, especially Jordan, and the rest of them are suffering from difficult living conditions under water and medicine shortage, high food prices, and the weakness of financial resources.

In the south of the Syrian capital, Damascus, violent clashes broke out between Palestinian armed groups and ISIS alongside Al Nusra Front, where clashes were concentrated in the Court area, Rija Square, and Ain Ghazal Street.

A number of social media pages shared news about the Prevention of the Syrian opposition armed groups in the town of Yalda of food entry into the Yarmouk refugee camp, where this decision was made, according to those pages, after the killing of three fighters of Sham Al Rasoul brigades by a member of ISIS the day before yesterday and he fled to Yarmouk.

Meanwhile, a number of activists assured the news that reported forming an alliance between the military battalions in the south of Damascus, to fight ISIS at Yarmouk, Al Hajar Al Aswad, Al Tadamon, and Al Qadam areas.

Coincided with a state of anxiety among residents of the camp for fear of deterioration of humanitarian situation which exacerbated due to this decision and the continued siege imposed on them by the regime and the Palestinian factions for about (748) days respectively.



In Damascus suburb, the AGPS correspondent reported news of a young man from Khan Dannon camp, who is pro-Syrian Regime, stabbed one of the regular army checkpoints member; according to the reporter that the altercation broke out between the young man and the member developed into a fist fight.

The correspondent noted that members of the detachment and Security launched a search and arrest campaign for the young man, but he went into hiding.

In a different context, a swing was fell and injured two girls from Khan Dannon camps causing them fractures in hand and foot, one in critical condition, according to residents testimony that the swing owner did not listen to their warnings and urged him to stop because it is in a bad condition.

Adding that the swing owner did not charged because he is protected from the members of the pro-Syrian regime civil Committees.

Regular army continues to prevent Palestinian refugees from Sbeina camp from returning to their homes, where they live a harsh humanitarian conditions because of the continued displacement for 610 days, because of the violent clashes that broke out between the regular army and armed opposition groups, which ended with the regular army full control over the camp, and the destruction of nearly 80% of its buildings.

Lebanon

Palestinians of Syria Committee in Lebanon implemented a series of visits in the third day of Eid for some families of Palestinian Syrian refugees with special needs, where the visit included the Al Burj, Al Rashideia, and Al Bass camps in Tire city South Lebanon, in order to see their living conditions and revive the spirit of social responsibility towards them.

It is mentioned that some gifts were distributed to the men and women with special needs during the visit.

Statistics

The AGPS monitoring and documentation team announced that it document images and names of 70 Palestinian victims who died due to torture and their photos were leaked from the Syrian regime's prisons and through testimonies of released detainees.



The AGPS confirmed that more than (6000) image for victims of torture in Syrian jails were leaked in the beginning of March 2015, including dozens of images that belong to Palestinian refugees, while activists and residents recognized (70) images, as one of the ex-prisoners reported the death of (8) detainees, bringing the death toll to 78 victims including 18 women.

Numbers and Statistics till 20/7/2015

- *80,000 Palestinian refugees escaped from Syria, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51300 refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till February 2015.*
- *At least 35,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 748 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 818 days, water was cut for 308 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 177 victims.*
- *Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 629 days respectively.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 610 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 812 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 455 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
