Latest Developments

Dozens of Palestinian women sheltered in refugee camps across the embattled Syrian territories have been incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups since the outburst of the Syrian warfare.

Others have been subjected to crackdowns at military checkpoints pitched near the main access roads to Palestinian refugee camps and Syrian towns.

According to AGPS data, 83 Palestinian female refugees are held in Syrian government jails, among whom 21 refugees taking shelter in Damascus and 21 others in Rif Dimashq. 10 female detainees were, meanwhile, identified as residents of Hums and four others as residents of Deraa. Two Palestinian women were arrested in Lebanon. The other refugees were kidnapped from Deraa, Latakia, Aleppo, and Hama, among other Syrian provinces.

The list of arrestees included university students, activists, young ladies, and mothers.





Other violations perpetrated against Palestinian women in Syria included murder, body mutilation, and sexual abuse, among other human rights violations that contravene international laws and treaties.

In another development, violent clashes burst out on Tuesday in Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees, south of Damascus, between pro-government militias, ISIS mobs, and AlNusra Front. At the same time, a round of mortar shells slammed into the camp, resulting in material damage.

Meanwhile, Deraa Camp for Palestinian refugees, in southern Syria, was struck with mortar shells on Tuesday. Violent clashes between the opposition outfits and the government squads further rocked the outer edges of the shelter.

Palestinian refugees in southern Syria, particularly those sheltered in Deraa Camp, have been enduring dire conditions due to the security mayhem, unabated shelling, and acute dearth in financial resources and health services.





According to unofficial data, the rampant hostilities took away the lives of dozens of Deraa residents and knocked down 70% of civilian buildings in the camp.

In a related development, residents of AlRaml Camp in Latakia have sounded the alarm over the arbitrary abduction sweeps and home break-ins carried out by the Syrian regime forces on a sporadic basis.

Residents of AlRaml camp further spoke out against the swift price hike and steep rental fees in the area.

Several youngsters fled the camp for fear of being kidnapped and forcibly enlisted at pro-regime battalions.

In the meantime, AGPS continues to sound the alarm over the mysterious fate of the Palestinian refugee Assif AlJamal, aged 44 and kidnapped from Rif Dimashq in August 29, 2013. His father is a native of the occupied West Bank, in Palestine.



AGPS urges the Syrian government to unearth the fate of 1,176 Palestinian refugees held captive in its penitentiaries.

- *1,176 Palestinian refugees, including 83 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,368 days in a row.*
- *193 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,074 and 882 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,418 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 152 days.*
- *Government troops ban residents of AlSbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,223 days running.*
- *Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
