Latest Developments

A Palestinian refugee stranded in Turkey has found no other way to reunite with his family in Germany than to hide into a truck loaded with aircraft tires bound for overseas shipment and parked on a street in the metropolitan Turkish city of Istanbul.

The refugee was spotted while hiding inside the truck at Ataturk International Airport.

He confessed that he illegally entered Turkey last month fleeing war-torn Syria. He sought to reunite with his family in Germany.

Police at Ataturk Airport turned him in to the concerned authorities pending the necessary legal procedures.

In another development, Palestinian refugee from Syria Sara Nizar Abu Rashed has earned a Bachelor's degree in international relations and creative writing with a "First Class Honors" from Denison University, Ohio, USA.

Sarra, 21, fled the war in Syria some eight years ago. She is a poet and has got contributions in dozens of books and magazines in the US. Her family is a native of Haifa city in occupied Palestine. She is a member of the Administrative Board of the Youth Creativity Forum at the IbdAA Cultural Center.

Sarra is planning to obtain an M.A. in English Literature. One of her poems was included in the English language curriculum for high school students in the United States. In 2018, she was chosen

among 20 students to attend the Conference on Democracy for Ambassadors in Greece.

Meanwhile, Palestinian and Syrian refugees took to streets in Izaz city, north of Syria, to celebrate the ceasefire deal between Israel and the Palestinian resistance.

The refugees chanted slogans in solidarity with Gaza and in protest at Israel's atrocious crimes against the Palestinians.

Recently, Rallies have swept Palestinian refugee camps in Syria in protest at the deadly Israeli airstrikes on Gaza and crackdowns on Palestinians in occupied Jerusalem.

The rallies took place in the refugee camps of Yarmouk, Jaramana, AlNeirab, Hindarat, AlAyedeen, and displacement camps set up in northern Syria.

Palestinian refugees voiced their strong condemnation of the latest surge in violence by Israeli forces and settler gangs and called on the international community to immediately step in.

In the meantime, AlShifaa Pharmacy in Deraa Camp for Palestinian refugees, south of Syria, was burglarized by anonymous thieves on Friday, May 21.

The thieves stole drugs and pain soothers along with a battery and a sum of money.

Property-theft attempts have increasingly been reported in Deraa Camp for Palestinian refugees, south of Syria.

The residents attributed the phenomenon to uncontrolled drug consumption and increasing unemployment rates.

The residents called on local authorities to take serious measures in response to property-theft and to protect residents from home-burglary.

In another development, residents of AlAyedeen camp for Palestinian refugees, in Hama, spoke out against the poor quality of bread sold in the area.

The locals said bread is unfit for human consumption. They denounced the insufficient quantity of flour allotted to the camp.

Residents of AlAyedeen camp also continue to set off alarm bells over the lack of basic services and dire socio-economic conditions rocking the area as a result of the steep rental fees, high rates of unemployment, and price hike.

The absence of relief assistance by UNRWA and other humanitarian institutions has made life unbearable in the Camp.
