Latest Developments

Reporting from Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees, south of Damascus, AGPS field reporter said a number of wounded fighters from Tahrir AlSham, formerly known as AlNusra Front, were evacuated from Yarmouk.

The evacuation dovetails the so-called Kafria and AlFou'a agreement struck between the Syrian government and Tahrir AlSham.



Meanwhile, Daraa Camp and AlMuzeireeb community, south of Syria, have run out of life-saving medical stuff and first-aid items. Most of the clinics and medical centers in the area have gone out of operation due to the deadly hostilities.

As a result, several sick and wounded civilians have gone untreated. The situation has been worsened by the quasi-chronic closure of the main access roads out of and into the area due to the simmering clashes.



In another development, Palestinian refugee Abdul Kadir Ali Rgheis was released from Syrian government penitentiaries, where he had been held for over three years.

Rgheis was kidnapped by the government troops at Hjeira checkpoint on May 1, 2014. Dozens of Palestinians were kidnapped on the same day on their way out of besieged Yarmouk via Ali AlWahsh thoroughfare, seeking a safer shelter. A number of arrestees were executed on the spot while the others were dragged to unknown locations.

Several civilians sheltered in Yarmouk have died as a result of the medical neglect and undernourishment inflicted by the tough blockade imposed by the Syrian regime forces and their war partners.



In the meantime, the Palestine Charity Commission distributed meet rations to Palestinian families displaced from Yarmouk in Yalda, Babila, and Beit Sahem.

Hundreds of Palestinian families were forced out of Yarmouk Camp for fear of being killed by ISIS militias, who have grabbed hold of large parts of the camp since early April 2015.



At the same time, a break-of-fast banquet was held on Tuesday by AllIslah Organization to displaced Palestinian families from Syria in Sidon Municipality.

Symbolic awards were handed over to children who participated in competitions and games staged during the event.

Palestinians of Syria: June 21, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,521 Palestinians, including 463 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,612 Palestinian refugees, including 100 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,428 days in a row.*
- *196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,164 and 1,015 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,508 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 242 days.*
- *Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until the end of 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
