***“Two Palestinian Refugees were killed Due to Torture in the Syrian Regime Prison, Raising the Death Toll to 281 Victims”***



- A Palestinian refugee from the Yarmouk camp was killed due to wounded he attained.
- Bombing targets Daraa camp for Palestinian refugees.
- Violent clashes broke out in the Yarmouk camp in Damascus.
- Concerns about the lives of the Palestinian activists in the Yarmouk camp, and calls to open a safe road for the civilians.
- Bombing targets Khan Al Sheih camp in Damascus suburb.
- Syrian circular about tightening the travel procedures of the Palestinian Syrian youth.
- Delay of issuing residencies and searching for houses are the main obstacles that face the Palestinian Syrian refugees in Sweden.

### ***Victims***

*Two Palestinian refugees were killed due to torture in the Syrian regime prisons, they are: Bilal Al Zaraa, lives at Haifa Street in the Yarmouk camp and was killed after being detained while leaving the camp by the members of Al Wahsh checkpoint about a year ago.*

*Mohammed Omar Saleim Al Omar from Al Aedein camp in Homs after being detained for more than two years, which raises the death toll of victims of torture, that was documented by the AGPS, to 281 victims.*

*Meanwhile, the Palestinian refugee Mohammed Zuhair Masreia was killed due to wounded he attained by a bombing that targeted the Yarmouk camp in Damascus.*

### ***Recent Updates***

*Bombing targeted different places of Daraa camp, while the residents are complaining of the continuous water crises for the 251 days respectively, as they have to use wells water to secure their needs, coincided with the power cut for long periods and the lack of food and fuel.*

*In a related context, violent clashes broke out at the Yarmouk camp yesterday between groups affiliated to the armed Syrian opposition inside the camp and the regular army alongside with groups of the PFGC, coincided with a number of shells targeted Al Yarmouk high school crossing at Al Shahid Jalal Akoush Street. Meanwhile the water crises is still continue for more than three months which led to many diseases such as Kidney disease and colon distention, according to a medical resource inside the camp to our correspondence.*

*On the other hand, a number of Palestinian and Syrian human rights activists expressed their concern about the fate of their relief and media activist colleges inside the camp, especially with the repeated assassinations which made by unknown groups, while some of them assumed responsibility to the groups affiliated to the Syrian opposition.*

*In the same context, activists from the Yarmouk camp launched a campaign on AFAZ website demanding the Red Cross and the UNRWA to*



*work on securing a safe road for the civilians to leave the camp, this campaign came after the increasing of civilian assassinations inside the camp and because of the continuous siege for two years and the hard living and security conditions which is threatened the life of thousands in light of, what was described by the activists, as Misuse of weapons scattered inside the camp and security chaos.*

*Meanwhile, warplanes hovered above Khan Al Sheih camp in Damascus suburb coincided with heavy explosion sounds resulted in the bombing of the surrounding places in light of the snipping and bombing of the only road that link the camp with the surroundings which is Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*

*On the other hand, the Syrian Directorate of Immigration and passport issued a circular states that not allowing those who finished the compulsory service and who is ready for a reserve to travel only after obtaining the approval of the recruitment division, it is noteworthy that such approval were included those who did not perform all military service. It is worth mentioning that hundreds of young Palestinians abstain from performing compulsory military service in the PLA for fear of being thrown in the battles for the Syrian army.*

*Turning to Sweden, where Palestinian Syrian refugees are living a different suffering of what forced them to leave their camps in Syria, since every stage of the resort there are problems facing them such as war and the death boats and its risks.*

*Palestinian refugees face another type of suffering, where those who arrived to Sweden are suffering from delayed procedures for obtaining residence and which may take up to more than a year in some cases, as their suffering is not only obtaining a residency but also to secure an accommodation, especially as most of them prefer housing in southern Sweden which led to a significantly rise in demand for homes, while Swedish immigration Department attributes the delay of issuing residencies for reasons related to the increased flow of refugees into its territory.*



### ***The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics till 21/12/2014***

- *At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *2580 Palestinian refugees were documented by the AGPS including 157 women, 279 were killed due to torture, 268 were killed by sniper shot, 84 refugees were field executed, and 984 refugees were killed due to bombing.*
- ***The Yarmouk Camp:** - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 534 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 615 days, water was cut for 104 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 157 victims.*
- *80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 14348 refugees in Jordan, 42,000 in Lebanon, according to UNRWA statistics till November 2014.*
- ***Al Husayneyya Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 436 days respectively.*
- ***Al Sbeina Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 406 days respectively.*
- ***Handarat Camp:** - Residents have left the camp for 607 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- ***Dara'a Camp:** - It is now almost 251 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- ***Jermana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:** - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
