"PRS in Chios Greek Island Address the Human Rights and International Organizations"

VICTIMS

The two Palestinian refugees “Ibrahim Ayyash Ibrahim” nicknamed “Abu Saliem” and “Hamza Hassan Issa” both were killed whilst fighting alongside the Syrian regime against the opposition in Zibdien area in Eastern Gota of Damascus Countryside.



It is noteworthy that the two victims were conscripted in the pro-regime so-called “Alawdaa Forces”, and both are from Al-Shamalna tribe from Al-Sayydia Zaynab Camp.

RECENT UPDATES

The Palestinian and Syrian refugees who fled the war in Syria streamed a video message from Chios Greek Island addressing all Human rights organizations, in which they demanded to be allowed to continue their trip towards west Europe countries to claim asylum.





The refugees described, in their message, the European-Turkish agreement as “Political Agreement that has no legal basis” which could be “a Punishment” to the refugees rather than a rescue, adding that “refugees should not be returned to countries of conflict”.

The refugees accused the European countries of accusing the Palestinian diaspora in the first place, demanding not to repeat it once again, according to them.

It is noteworthy that the European-Turkish agreement has caused thousands of migrants an additional suffering, especially those of are stuck at the Macedonian borders.

In a different topic, the Syrian regime’s forces targeted the outskirts of Khan Eshieh camp in Damascus Countryside. Activists reported 14 explosive barrels were dropped on the region, especially on Al-Abbasa and Al-Qusour areas.

Also, a sporadic clashes occurred near Al-Salam motorway, during which, the regime’s military on Al-Kabousiyya hill fired the heavy machineguns fire.





It is noteworthy that this continuous targeting to the camp and its outskirts is causing a state of tension and horror amongst civilians especially children, pushing many to flee the camp and settle in the surrounding areas or even to claim asylum in Europe.

In his turn, the AGPS' Executive Manager Ahmed Hussein, in a statement to Al-Jazeera Net following the PRC's seminar yesterday, stressed on the importance of such events and symposiums in delivering the Palestinian refugees' message to the international community and in introducing the case to the world.

Hussein added "these events shed light on the refugees issue as a human rights complicated issue since they are recognized by the United Nations as refugees but they do not get the needed protection nor neutralization from the military works in Syria".

The AGPS' Executive Manager said "these seminars come as part of a plane of action adopted by the Palestinian organizations in Europe to shed light on the case of Palestinian refugees in Syria, who have been affected by the war roughly, exposed to different kinds of violations, killing, arresting, siege and not ending by evacuating from their camps and houses".

Hussein indicated that the AGPS and the PRC are seeking, together, to update the position to the British MPs, parties and decision makers to achieve the political and security advantages to meet the minimum protection, as well as to include the Palestinian refugees in the humanitarian programs funded by the European Governments in order to



achieve the decent life level until they return back to their homelands in Palestine.

It is noteworthy that the Palestinian Return Centre in cooperation with the Scottish National Party have organized, yesterday, a seminar on Palestinians of Syria issue held in the British House of Commons in London.



Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 23 March 2016

- *15,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan,*
- *6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command), continued for 1012 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 1073 days, water cut for 561 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 186 victims.*

- *Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 868 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1059 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 722 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.*
- *Jarmana, AL-Saieda Zainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and Al-AedeinHama: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al-Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.*
