Recent Updates

The Syrian security forces released three students who were arrested yesterday near the entrance of the Yarmouk camp in Damascus, while the young man "Obada Al Khatieb" is still detained. The students were arrested while they were leaving the Yarmouk camp to apply to the high school exams, within 66 students, males and females, after the Syrian security forces approval, with the PLO guarantees. It is noted that this is not the first time for the Syrian security to arrest the refugees after approving their exit.

In a related context, the documentation and monitoring team of the AGPS documented the names of 4 refugees from the Yarmouk camp who died since the beginning of January 2015 due to the siege and the lack of medical care. The victims are: Samier Hussain Salfiety, was born on 1951, who died due to a heart attack and lack of suitable medical care, Mohammed Mustafa, the new born baby, from Shihaby family died due to the lack of medical care and supplies, the refugee woman " Nadwa Hassan Elwan", was born on 1943, who died due to dehydration because of malnutrition and lack of medical care. It is worth mentioning that the number of starvation, siege, and lack of medical care victims from the Yarmouk camp has reached 161 refugees according to the AGPS statistics.

In the same context, medical sources reported that the jaundice was spread again in the Yarmouk camp due to the siege that is imposed on the camp by the regular army and the PFGC for 567 days respectively, 137 days were without water, which led to the spread of many diseases; such as jaundice and other diseases related to the lack of water; such as kidney and pancreas disease, in addition to the diseases related to hygiene; such as skin diseases.

It is noted that the hospitals and the medical centers in the Yarmouk camp were targeted to frequent shelling which caused destructions and damages to the medical supplies, especially the operations devices, as well as the ambulances and its crew. Meanwhile Palestine hospital is still working with its minimum capacity in light of the siege imposed on the Yarmouk camp, and the prevention of entering medical cadres and supplies, medicine, the continuing power cut, and the prevention of entering fuel needed to operate the hospitals.

In the south of Syria, Palestine Charity Committee distributed 100 food baskets to the Palestinian refugee residents of Al Muzaireib compound, as the Committee carried out visits to the elderly people to be familiar with their needs and to give them help. This comes amid the severe crises of the high prices and the lack of water and power for long periods, in addition to the shelling of the Syrian warplanes once in a while, which resulted in some victims, that the AGPS documented 31 of them.

On the other hand, the Supreme Administrative Court in Berlin decided to stop the deportation of the Syrian and the Palestinian refugees in Germany, who left their fingerprints at Hungary. This decision comes due to the ill-treatment suffered by refugees in Hungary, which complain of the increase of the refugees' number.

It is worth mentioning that the Federal Office for Migration and Refugees in Germany had circulated a decision from mid-October 2014, accelerates the procedures of the asylum seekers; Syrians, Iraqis, and Palestinians.

Numbers and Statistics till 23/1/2015

- *At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *2612 Palestinian refugees were documented by the AGPS.*
- ***The Yarmouk Camp:** - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 567 days respectively. In addition, power cuts*

continued for more than 647 days, water was cut for 137 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 162 victims.

- **80,000** Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including **14348** refugees in Jordan, **42,000** in Lebanon, according to UNRWA statistics till November 2014.
- **Al Husayneyya Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **469** days respectively.
- **Al Sbeina Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **438** days respectively.
- **Handarat Camp:** - Residents have left the camp for **640** days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- **Dara'a Camp:** - It is now almost **284** days without water and **70%** of its buildings were demolished.
- **Jermana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:** - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- **Khan Al Sheih Camp:** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
