### **“Aggravated Economic Crises Suffered by the Displaced Palestinian Families at the Eastern Areas in Damascus”**

### Recent Update

Hundreds of Palestinian families, who were displaced from their camps because of the shelling and the siege to Al-Dokhaneia, Al-Kabbas, and Douelaa areas east of the capital Damascus, are suffering of aggravated economic crisis.

The economic crises caused by the spread of unemployment, the lack of shelter especially in light of the significant rise in homes' rents, in addition to many conditions imposed by homeowners.

For their part, residents demanded UNRWA, PLO, and Palestinian factions to shoulder their responsibilities towards them, and to work in order to bring them back to their camps such as Husseinia, Sbeineh, and Yarmouk camp.



It is noteworthy that a large number of Palestinian families in that area were forced to flee again on 12/09/2014 after the opposition fighters stormed Dokhaneia area and controlled the nearby neighborhoods of Jaramana, Ain Tarma, and Kabbas areas.

On the other hand, sounds of heavy explosions caused by the bombing of surrounding areas with land – land rockets that rocked Nairab Camp



in Aleppo, yesterday morning, resulted in a state of tension among residents.

The AGPS reporter pointed out that the camp – Aleppo road is still closed due to clashes and sniping between the regular army and the forces of the Syrian armed opposition.

Members of the regular army transferred the way from inside Ramouseh Artillery College to pass the area that witnesses sniping operations.

It is noteworthy that the tense security situation in the city of Aleppo – Neirab camp reflects negatively on the residents and their movement, while many of them died and wounded due to the ongoing war.

The dire economic situation forced some residents to participate in the conflict, while hundreds of Palestinian families and youth left the camp as a result of the security and living conditions headed for Turkey and European countries.





In the south of Syria, water cut at Deraa camp enters its 550 day respectively, prompting residents to rely on well water completely, while power outages increased the difficulty of extracting those waters, forcing residents to rely on diesel engines to raise water from wells.

It is noteworthy that the repeated shelling and clashes that targeted the camp resulted in the destruction of (70%) of the camp's buildings, prompting hundreds of families to flee to other towns and refugee camps.

The AGPS monitoring and documentation team documented more than (3052) Palestinians Syrian refugees who died because of the ongoing war, as bombing resulted in the death of (1052) Palestinian refugees, while (673) refugees died because of clashes between the regular army and the Syrian armed opposition groups, while (421) refugees died due to torture in prisons and detention centers.

It is noteworthy that the AGPS allows researchers, activists, and human rights organizations access to its figures on its website, [actionpal.org.uk](http://actionpal.org.uk) Residents of Jaramana and Khan Danno Camps in Damascus suburb organized a march in solidarity with people of the occupied territories and Jerusalem, where dozens gathered after Friday prayers, in the camp, waving banners in solidarity with people of Jerusalem.





In the same context, Palestinians of Syria Committee in Lebanon participated in the opening ceremony of "Jerusalem in the Eyes" exhibition, which was held in the municipality of Sidon, south Lebanon on Thursday, 22 October within the framework of supporting activities of Jerusalem and Al Aqsa Mosque .



### **Numbers and Statistics till 23/10/2015-:**

- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: – Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 844 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 914 days, water was cut for 404 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 182 victims .
- Al Sbeina Camp: – Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 705 days respectively.

- Handarat Camp: – Residents have left the camp for 906 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: – It is now almost 550 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: – A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: – Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia– Khan Al Shieh road.
