"Military Actions' Pace Rise in Deraa Camp, amid Absence of Water and Medical Services"

Victims

The Palestinian refugee «Ahmed Issa Hamada» from Yarmouk died due to torture in the Syrian prisons, where his wife was informed with his death when she went to ask about him in one of the security branches, and she received his ID and belongings.

It is mentioned that the AGPS documented 407 victims of Palestinian refugees who died due to torture in the prisons of the Syrian regime.

Recent Updates

Sharp military actions took place at Deraa camp south of Syria, and adjacent areas, while warplanes launched several military raids, one of which targeted the house of a civilian in the camp the day before yesterday, which resulted in at least four civilian victims, most of them are children.



Meanwhile, residents of Deraa camp south of Syria complain of absence of any hospital or medical center, and suffer from a severe shortage of medicines and materials for first aid and



medical equipment, in addition to the lack of ambulances to transport the wounded to receive medical treatment outside the camp, and the sniper transfer injuries outside the camp for treatment.

The Syrian regular army impede the arrival of ambulances, and in case any resident managed to bring the wounded out of the camp in an attempt to be treated in hospitals, Jordan refuses the entry of any Palestinian refugees from Syria even if he was injured.

Moreover, a number of activists inside the camp warned of the spread of diseases among residents in light of having to use contaminated drinking water, due to drinking water cut for about (459) days.

On the other hand, sporadic clashes broke out in the Yarmouk camp on Thursday night between pro-regime Palestinian groups and ISIS alongside Al-Nusra Front causing no significant progress for each party, where ISIS still controls 60% of the camp, while the regular army and armed groups dominated on 40%.

In terms of living aspect, the remaining residents at Yarmouk are suffering of tragic situations as a result of lack of food and water continued cut since September 2014 and electricity cut for (822) days all over the camp.





In the same context, medical sources said, "The numbers of jaundice and typhoid cases among children, women, and the elderly have recently risen in Yarmouk, due to malnutrition and lack of health care and hygiene, resulting from the continued dominance of ISIS on the Yarmouk refugee camp and the aggravated blockade imposed by the regular army and groups of the PFGC for (752) days, as well as to prevention of entering urgent relief and medical assistance to the camp."

Turkey

General Authority for Palestinian Refugee Affairs of the Syrian temporary government of the Syrian opposition demanded the Palestinians of Syria to stop going through what it called "overland smuggling ports" in the two security regions, which have been adopted by the Turkish authorities in the state of Kilis border.

According to the statement that was published by the General Authority on its website, refugees should stop going through those ports from 23 to 28 of this month in order to preserve their lives.

It is worth mentioning that the Syrian-Turkish border is witnessing an unprecedented tension, following the bombings inside Turkish territory.

Italy

Some news agencies shared information about the sinking of about 40 migrants, following the sinking of a rubber boat off the Libyan coast on Wednesday.

According to the agencies, the survivors who have been received by the Supreme Commission for Refugees, which are



supervised by the United Nations, confirmed that about 40 people died after the sinking of a rubber boat carrying them to the European coasts.

According to the sources, the survivors had arrived from the death journey to the Italian coast, specifically to Cecilia, where the official spokesman for the Authority Federico Fauci said that almost 35 to 40 people died at sea while trying to access to the Italian beaches.

Meanwhile, the AGPS could not get any additional information about the names and nationalities of victims until the moment.

It is noteworthy that thousands of Palestinian refugees are risking their lives to reach Europe from Libya and the Turkish coast.





Numbers and Statistics till 24/7/2015:-

- 80,000 Palestinian refugees escaped from Syria, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51300 refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till February 2015.
- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 756 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 826 days, water was cut for 316 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 177 victims.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 637 days respectively.
- Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 618 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 820 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 463 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
