



Victims

A two-day old infant died in the Yarmouk camp due to malnutrition and lack of medical care, raising the siege victims toll to 162 victims who died due to starvation and lack of medical care.

The baby girl "Sahar Yasein Abdulrahman Harfoush" from Daraa camp south of Syria died due to wounded she attained by the shelling that targeted the camp earlier with a number of mortar shells.

Meanwhile, two soldiers of the PLO; Muhannad Mohammed Faris and Abdul latief Saed Ghazawi died due to the ongoing war in Syria, with no details.

In the same context, the Palestinian Syrian refugee "Ibrahim Al Handawi" was found killed by gunshots in a lane at Al Raas Al Ahmar neighborhood in Ain Al Hilwa camp, Lebanon. The security forces rushed immediately and started the investigations about his murder. News reported that the young man is 17 years, a Palestinian Syrian refugee from Syria and lives at Al Tawarea area at Ain Al Hilwa camp.

Recent Updates

The strict siege imposed on the Yarmouk camp continues for 568 days respectively in light of the continuous power and water cut, coincided with the suspension of distributing urgent food and medical aids to about 20.000 besieged people for 6 weeks. The thing that led to the



exacerbating of health and living situation, as the total toll of malnutrition and lack of medical care victims has been raised to 162 victims were documented by the AGPS.

In Damascus suburb, the surrounding towns of Khan Al Shieh camp were targeted by sporadic bombing with many kinds of shells that targeted Mazarea Al Qosour area, in addition to the clashes that broke out at Al Salam highway.

Meanwhile, the crisis of the fuel and the high prices of food supplies are still continuous due to the frequent closure of all roads that link the camp with city center, except for Zakia road, which is targeted with heavy gun machines once in a while. It is mentioned that the AGPS documented 94 victims from the camp who were killed due to the ongoing war in Syria.

In Germany, a number of Palestinian activists organized a solidarity sit-in with the Palestinians of Syria in Berlin the capital of Germany in front of the Brandenburg Gate. The activists demanded the neutralization of the Palestinian refugees of the war events of Syria, the release of all detainees in the Syrian prisons, Open a humanitarian corridor in the Yarmouk refugee camp under international protection, the introduction of food and medical aids, and the resumption of providing the camp with water and power supply.

This comes within the Palestinian public mobility and the campaign of "Save the Palestinians of Syria" in solidarity with the Palestinians of Syria in General and the Yarmouk camp in particular.

Numbers and Statistics till 24/1/2015

- *At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *2616 Palestinian refugees were documented by the AGPS.*
- ***The Yarmouk Camp:** - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 568 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 648 days, water was cut for 138 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 162 victims.*
- *80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 14348 refugees in Jordan, 42,000 in Lebanon, according to UNRWA statistics till November 2014.*
- ***Al Husayneyya Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 470 days respectively.*
- ***Al Sbeina Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 439 days respectively.*
- ***Handarat Camp:** - Residents have left the camp for 641 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- ***Dara'a Camp:** - It is now almost 285 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- ***Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:** - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- ***Khan Al Sheih Camp:** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
