"Opposition Battalions in Khan Al-Sheih to Retreat to Idlib as Deal with Government Forces is just around the Corner"

Latest Developments

A deal is expected to be struck between the Syrian government forces and the opposition outfits in Khan Al-Sheih town.

Speaking with AGPS on conditions of anonymity, sources from the Khan Al-Sheih refugee camp said the agreement stipulates that the opposition battalions retreat to Idlib and hand over 400 automatic rifles and heavy and medium firearms to the regime troops. The opposition fighters are also to withdraw safely from the area accompanied by their family members and personal arms.



According to the same source, 300 civilian residents of Khan Al-Sheih will be allowed a safe access to Idlib with their families.

A couple of days earlier, a 48-hour truce deal has been put into effect for the second round of talks, expected to be wrapped up soon.

Last week, similar talks reached a deadlock after the regime army stepped up deadly offensives on the camp at the same time as the armed opposition groups showed an unbending rebuff of appeals to retreat to Deraa without their military hardware.



Meanwhile, the Syrian government squads on Thursday morning struck the Deraa Camp for Palestinian refugees, in southern Syria, and the adjacent al-Sadd Road with gas cylinders, inflicting heavy material damage on civilian homes.

70 % of civilian structures in the camp have already been turned into mounds of rubble due to the raging hostilities.

In a related development, the blockade on Al-Muzeireeb refugee community marred the joy felt by al-Rabi' family after the mother gave birth to triplets—Ayssar, Ali, and Abdullah. The mother was hospitalized for 10 days in the local underequipped clinic after she had been diagnosed with renal insufficiency due to a severe hemorrhage infecting her vulnerable body right after the labor and delivery process.

The father, himself torn from the nourishment of home, launched cries for help, saying that he has been earning less than \$1 a day. He spoke out against the tragic upshots of the blockade and the striking upsurge in food prices along with the lack of aids from UNRWA and charities.





He added that he has found enormous difficulties securing the daily milk flagon to feed his newly-born triplets after it has reached up to 3,000 Syrian Liras in government-led areas.

Palestinian refugees taking shelter in Deraa, Al-Muzeireeb, Gilin, Tel Shihab, and other areas have been subjected to dire living conditions due to the raging warfare.

The situation has taken a turn for the worse due to the lack of medical care. According to AGPS correspondent, Deraa camp has been bereaved of all its hospitals, clinics, first-aid equipment, and ambulances.

Activists warned of the swift propagation of deadly infections and syndromes due to the contaminated water they have been forced to drink as a result of the water cut going on for 958 days running.

Local activists attributed the exacerbated situation in southern Syria to the tough blockade imposed by the Syrian Regular Army and the abrupt offensives on local hospitals, forcing medics and paramedics to give up their jobs.

Rampant clashes between armed opposition groups and ISIS militias have also blocked civilians' movement inside and out. The Jordanian authorities prevented Palestinians from Syria to receive medical treatment in Jordan, forcing a number of refugees to pose as Syrian nationals.

Moving northwards, youngster Khaled Mansour, taking refuge in Al-Neirab Camp in Aleppo, sustained wounds as he fought alongside the



pro-government Liwa Al-Quds brigades in Al-Aweija area, adjacent to Handarat Camp.

AGPS documented the death of 809 Palestinian refugees while engaged in battles with and against the Syrian regime troops since the outburst of hostilities in embattled Syria.

In another development, dozens of Palestinians took to Deir Al-Balah Streets, in the blockaded Gaza Strip, on Wednesday to voice their firm condemnation of the ongoing onslaughts on Khan Al-Sheih Camp using internationally-banned weaponry.

The rally-goers further slammed the tight blockade imposed on the camp since the start of September.

The Gazan demonstrators called for the immediate protection of Khan Al-Sheih refugees, urging the international community to take action and work on providing civilians with basic foodstuff and medicines.





They further appealed for lifting the oppressive siege and ceasing deadly onslaughts on the camp.

Some 1,000 Palestinians returned to the blockaded Gaza Strip for fear of being killed in the uncontrolled fighting.

Palestinians of Syria: November 24, 2016 Statistics:

- *There are 15,500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees in Jordan.*
- *42,500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are in Lebanon.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt, according to UNRWA figures covering the period from July 2015 backwards.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees reside in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
- *Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,255 days in a row. Electricity and water supplies have been cut off, respectively, for 1,314 days and 775 days. The number of those killed due to the blockade has hit 190.*
- *Sbiena refugee camp: Refugees could not go back to their homes as a result of the blockade slapped by the Syrian regime forces since 1,108 days running.*

- *Handarat refugee camp: All refugees left the camp since 1,300 days after opposition outfits grabbed hold of the area.*
- *Deraa refugee camp: Water has been cut off for 958 consecutive days while 70% of its buildings have been knocked down.*
- *Homs camp, Hama camp, Jaramana camp, al-Sayda Zeinab camp, Al-Raml camp: A of State of relative calm has been reported in the abovementioned areas. However, economic crises have been on the rise.*
- *Khan al-Sheih refugee camp: All access roads out of and into the camp have been closed off by the Syrian regime army for 57 days running.*
