"Shelling on Khan Eshieh Camp Results in Many Victims and Injuries"



- A Palestinian-Syrian refugee killed in Yalda Town during clashes with ISIS.

VICTIMS

The Palestinian-Syrian refugee "Mohammad Hameed Al-Kafri" was killed in Yalda Town during clashes between armed opposition groups and ISIS forces took place in Yarmouk-Yalda front, Mohammad the father of two girls had been displaced from his house in Yarmouk Camp preciously, and originally descends from Loubiya village in Palestine 1948.



RECENT UPDATES

Al-Zuhour Street in Khan Eshieh Camp has been hit by heavy artillery shelling which caused two deaths at least and many injuries; this raises the total number of victims to 5 within the last 48 hours only.

The Syrian warplanes have dropped four explosive barrels over the vicinity of Khan Eshieh Camp causing a status of high tension amongst the civilians and the children particularly. Two explosive barrels hit the adjacent areas of Al-Salam Autostrade and the other two hit the farms near the secondary school of the camp.



It is noteworthy that all the roads of the camp are still closed by the Syrian regime's forces which affected negatively the economic situation inside the camp and caused a major shortage in the basic needs.



In a different context, the monitoring and documentation team in the AGPS assured that 415 female victims have been killed during the conflict in Syria, while 75 others are still unaccounted for inside the prisons of the Syrian regime, according to the same source.

Moving to Turkey, 9 immigrants died yesterday in a sinking incident off the coasts of Turkish Izmir City where their wooden boat drowned while trying to reach Greece. Anadolu Agency assured that the inspecting and searching teams of Turkish Coastguards have launched operations in that specific area after being notified about the incident, mentioning that they managed to rescue 21 immigrants and still searching for 11 others.

The Agency added that a diving team has been sent to the area as the survivors reported many other fellows trapped inside the closed section of the wooden boat.



It is noteworthy that the Aegean Sea is witnessing many similar incidents recently which caused the death of tens and hundreds due to the high level of waves and high speed wind and the weakness of immigrants' boats which are not able to withstand such extreme weather conditions.



CIVIL SOCIETY WORK

The "Charity Association to Relief the People of Palestine" in cooperation with Malaysian "Perdana Organization" has distributed 560 winter covers to 250 Palestinian-Syrian families displaced from Syria to Rashidiya Camp in Tyre City of Lebanon. The two organizations assured their intension to continue supporting the displaced refugees with all resources available, referring to the increasing burdens on charities because of some international organizations gave up some of its humanitarian duties.





Palestinians of Syria in numbers and Statistics until 24 December 2015

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *More than 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command), continued for 906 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 976 days, water cut for 466 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 184 victims .*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 767 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 968 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 612 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.*
- *Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Homs and Aedein Hamma: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.*
