### *"The Toll Death Of Palestinian Victims In Al-Sayeda Zainb Bombings Risen To 37"*



- Targeting the outskirts of Khan Esheih camp by missiles and explosive barrels.
- Relatives of Palestinian victims, who killed at Turkish borders, demanding the Palestinian institutions to intervene in order to bury the bodies of their loved ones.
- UNRAW and Hamas condemn the bombings in Al-Sayeda Zainb in Rural Damascus.
- 900 school books entered the besieged camp of Yarmouk.

## **VICTIMS**

*The toll death of Palestinian victims in Al-Sayeda Zainb has risen to 37. It has been documented 17 men, 13 women and 7 children; most of them from Al-Sayeda Zainb camp. The victims named as following:*

*Men: Hassan Habeeb, Hakam Habeeb, Khaled Abdullah Rahal, Mohammed Mahmoud Marea, Ibrahim Kamel Ibrahim, Yasser Jihad Rohban, Naser Ahmad Hamoud, Ali Marea Abdullah, Haitham Sulaiman Khza'ee, Ahmad Al-Dakheel, Haitham Al-Dakheel, Abdelrahman Hadeed, Ali Mousa Abdullah, Ali Marea, Ahmad Mahmoud Jafran, Kinan Saleh and Haitham Mohammed Sulaiman. *It is worth mentioning that Al-Sayeda Zainb and the area around the camp is fully subjected to the control of Assad regime and the loyal Palestinian factions of PFLP-GC, Fateh Al-Intifada and the Palestinian Popular Struggle Front (PPSF).*

*In the same context, UNRWA has condemned the bombings targeted Al-Sayeda Zainb in 21 February which resulted in 120 victims, according to UNRWA's statement. UNRWA expressed its condemnation in the strongest terms, and described the accident as "reckless massacre" that aimed to kill as many as possible of civilians. For its part, Hamas condemned the bombings in Al-Sayeda Zainb, where the Refugee Department in Hamas called in its statement the United Nation and its agency of UNRWA for serious working in order to securing a safe life for Palestinian refugees. The Hamas statement hoped for creating effective solutions to end the conflict in Syria; calling all parties to condemn the bloody explosion.*

### **RECENT UPDATES**

*The Syrian warplanes targeted the farms around Khan Esheih camp yesterday by explosive barrels and missiles. The bombs were dropped on Al-Rida road in the outskirts of the camp causing a panic state among locals particularly, children and women. In addition, the planes has shelled Al-Salam highway by two explosive barrels, from Al-Husseineih direction. The shelling coincided with another bombing targeted farms located between Khan Esheih and Darkhabia by four missiles. On the*



*other hand, the Syrian army targeted the road of Zakia-Khan Esheih by heavy guns.*

*In a different context, families of the Palestinian victims who killed at the Turkish borders appealed the Palestinian institutions in Turkey to intervene for burying the bodies of their loved ones. It is worth noting that the bodies are still in one of Turkish military hospitals near the border crossing of Khabour with Kurdistan north Iraq, according to the victims' families. The relatives of the victim, Hanan Mousa, added that the measures of the funeral are required an approval from the Turkish military judge in Sharnaq. They assured that the bodies of Hanan Mousa, Amminah Khaled Saleh and Imad Ibraheem Azouz are still in the mortuary of the hospital since two weeks. The families demanded for bodies to be buried according to Shariaa (Islamic law). It is worth mentioning that all victims are from Al-Sayeda Zainb camp.*



### **NGOs**

*The Charity Commission For Relief The Palestinian People introduced 900 books for Abdelqader Al-Hussaini High School. The books come to meet the needs of the students in the besieged camp of Yarmouk.*



*UNRWA announced on its website that there is a huge proportion of Palestinian students in Syria have been forced to leave their school due to poverty and unemployment. It is indicated that the conflict in Syria is still affecting directly the educational process of Palestinian refugees who live in Syria. Most of high schools students in Yarmouk camp living amid fears of arresting or killing if they left the camp to take the exams outside the camp.*



### ***Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 25 February 2016***

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 42,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command), continued for 985 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more*

*than 1047 days, water cut for 535 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 186 victims.*

- *Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 841 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1034 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 695 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.*
- *Jarmana, AL-SaiedaZainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and AedeinHama: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.*
