



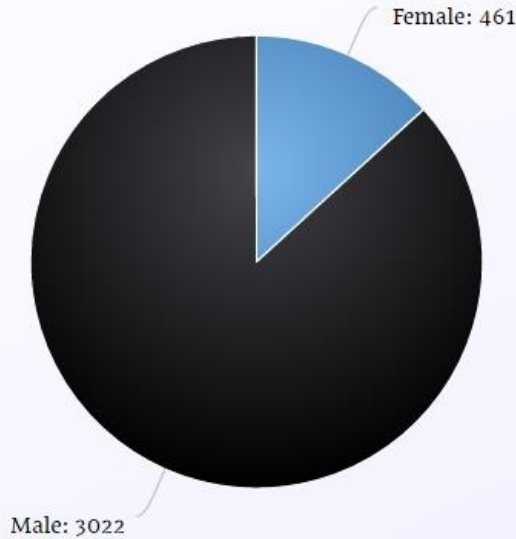

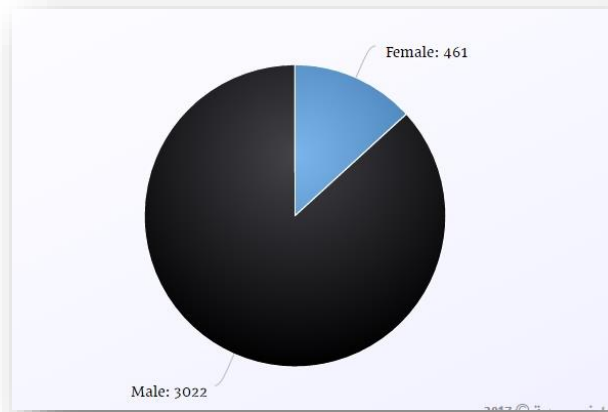

Latest Developments

AGPS documented the death of 461 Palestinian female refugees in the beleaguered Syrian territory due to warfare, the blockade, hostilities, and torture in Syrian government jails.

As many as 3,483 Palestinian refugees were pronounced dead in war-torn Syria.



No official Palestinian bodies, including the Palestinian Embassy in Damascus and the Palestine Liberation Organization, have kept record of a thorough database on the Palestinians of Syria.

Meanwhile, a series of protest moves was held by the Palestinian refugees displaced from Yarmouk to Yalda town, south of Damascus, in solidarity with the Palestinian detainees who have been on an open-ended hunger strike for the 10th day running in Israeli jails.

“The Palestinians of Syria know very well how it feels like to be detained and tortured,” activist Abu Ahmed said. “The Palestinians of Syria have been enduring a similar fate as their brothers and sisters in Israeli jails.”



AGPS kept record of the incarceration of 1,187 Palestinian refugees in Syrian government lock-ups, where 461 refugees also died under torture.



Meanwhile, the Palestinian refugee Ubaida Ahmed Darwish, a resident of Hums-based AlAydeen Camp, has gone missing since May 3, 2013.

19-year-old Ubaida was kidnapped by the government forces at a military checkpoint pitched near Hums campus.

In another development, residents of AlAydeen Camp in Hama, home to several families displaced from Damascus, Rif Dimashq, Aleppo, Idlib, Hama, Deir AlZor, AlRiqa, Daraa, and Latakia, continue to sound distress signals over the tough security cordon imposed by the regime army on the main access roads to the camp, along with the crackdowns and abduction sweeps targeting civilians on a sporadic basis.

The dramatic rise in unemployment rates has made the situation far worse in an area where survival largely hinges on relief aids.



Palestinians of Syria: April 25, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,483 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,187 Palestinian refugees, including 87 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,377 days in a row.*
- *195 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,108 and 959 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,452 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 186 days.*
- *Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
