“Palestinians and Syrians continue their sit-in in Greece and Fainting Cases amongst the Protesters and the Hunger-Strikers”



- Clashes broke out in the vicinity of the Yarmouk camp.
- The water is still cut on the Yarmouk and Daraa caps.
- The power returns back to Khan Al Sheih camp after being cut for more than 20 hours.
- Real humanitarian tragedy to the residents of Handarat camp in light of not securing their humanitarian needs.
- Palestinians of Syria sit-in in front of the UNHCR in Beirut.

Greece

Dozens of Palestinians and Syrians continue their sit-in and hunger strike in the Greece capital Athena, protesting on the Greece authorities strict procedures towards them. Our correspondent reported that there were number of fainting cases amongst the protesters due to the severe hunger and cold, as they were transferred to the hospital. It is worth mentioning that Greece is considered the main gate for the refugee to escape of the ongoing war in Syria to Europe searching for safety, but the strict Greece security procedures have prevented hundreds of them to reach their destination, forcing them to stay in Greece on their own expense.

Recent Updates

Clashes broke out between the Syrian regular army alongside with groups of the PFGC and the armed groups affiliated to the Syrian opposition at the Yarmouk camp municipality crossing in Palestine Street, those clashes come in light of the continued siege imposed on the camp.

In the same context, water cuts in Daraa camp southern Syria for 225 days respectively, and in the Yarmouk refugee camp for 78 days respectively, which exacerbated the living crises in the both camps where the Yarmouk still besieged by the regular army and the PFGC, while Daraa camp witnesses an acute shortage of medical and relief services.

Our correspondent from inside Khan Al Sheih camp in Damascus suburbs reported news of the return of electricity to all houses and lanes of the camp after being cut for more than twenty hours. Meanwhile, the residents of the camp complain of stressful living crises due to the deteriorating security situation in the surrounding areas, and the continued closure of Zakia -Khan Al Sheih road, the only road linking the camp to the capital Damascus.

On the other hand, the people of Handarat camp suffering is still getting worse after they were displaced from their homes under the hum of bullets and shells due to the ongoing conflict in Syria and control the Free Army and groups at their camp, they face a real humanitarian



tragedy in the absence of securing all necessities and humanitarian needs.

The groups of "Free Syrian Army" have been able, on April 27, 2013, to impose full control of Handarat camp in the countryside of Aleppo after battles that lasted for days.

Handarat camp was named for the nearby village, while the other name (Ein Al Tal) was named for the Ein Al Tal labs Near to the camp, the camp is located on a high rocky north-east of the city of Aleppo, 13 km far from the city center.

Ain Al Tal camp is bordered from the north by Handarat Aleppo and its territory, and from the east, Al Shahir area and Hills, on the south by the Canadian hospital and Al Ouieja area, while to the west, Al BAqara area there is also Ain Al Tal fabric labs.

Civil Work Committees

Palestine Charity Committee launched a campaign "Let us Make Their Winter Warm" in order to protect the Yarmouk camp poor families of the winter coldness and to help them bearing its difficult weather. The campaign also included a number of displaced families from Sbeina, Hujaira, Huusaineia, Al Bowaida, and Ghazal area

Lebanon

A number of Palestinians of Syria in Lebanon, organized, yesterday, a sit-in in front of the UNHCR in Beirut calling to transfer the Palestinian refugees file from the UNRWA to the UNHCR due to the failure of UNRWA to take its responsibilities towards them, the protesters also condemned the UNRWA last decision of preventing financial aids to more than thousand displaced Palestinian Syrian family, at the end of the sit-in the protesters handed a statement with their requires to the manager of the UNHCR.

The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics till 24/11/2014

- *The number of Palestinian refugee **victims** in Syria has reached **2556**.*
- ***The Yarmouk Camp**: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for **508** days respectively. In addition, power cuts*

continued for more than 591 days, water was cut for 78 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 157 victims.

- *41 Palestinian refugees were killed outside of Syria.*
- *96 PLA members were killed due to Clashes in Syria.*
- *Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 410 days respectively.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 380 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 580 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 225 days without water and a complete absence of basic services.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia road.*
- *Khan Danoun Camp: - Economic crisis is still continuing, specially unemployment and high prices.*
- *Al Nairab Camp: - Power is still cut for more than a year.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quite situation in light of the economic crises.*
