“Compulsory Military Service Obligates the Palestinian Syrian Youth to Leave Syria”



Lieutenant "Adham Nasri Saleh" from the PLO were killed due to clashes

Victims

The Colonel "Fathi Othman" and the lieutenant "Adham Nasri Saleh" from the PLO were killed due to clashes that broke out in Damascus city. "Mohammed Mahmoud Ahmed", a PLO soldier, was killed at Al Swaidaa city, which raises the toll of the PLO victims, which were documented by the Action Group for Palestinians of Syria, to 91 victims.

Recent Updates

The Palestinian refugee youth in Syria are living in a huge state of anxious due to the emphasis on requesting them for mandatory service in the PLO, where the intercalation of the Palestinian Liberation Army in the fighting battles with the regular army of apprehensions, doubles their fears.

91 members of the PLO were killed; most of them were killed in the battles in Damascus city, which Prompting most of the Palestinian youth to refrain from performing compulsory military service for fear of being forced to engage in battles in favor of the regular army, which prompted many of them to leave Syria and travel to neighboring countries such as Turkey, Lebanon, and Egypt previously. Some of them settled there and the others completing their way towards the European countries.

The young man, "Mohammed", who is currently in the Netherlands, said to our correspondent there, "Death at sea was the best to me a thousand times of military service, I will not participate to kill any Syrian whatever direction ..." while Ahmed, a Palestinian refugee in Turkey, said "despite the difficulty of living in Turkey, but that is a thousand times better than to become the target of this or that party,"

It is mentioned that the Action Group have documented 91 victims of the PLO members were killed in Syria. As in Damascus, the siege imposed on the Yarmouk camp by the regular army and groups of the PFGC for 478 days in light of the continued water cuts for 48 days respectively. Meanwhile, the camp is suffering from harsh living crises, especially with the stop of all bakeries and hospitals except Palestine hospital which works with its minimum capacity.



The beginning of the winter has worsen the difficulty of conditions in light of the complete absence of fuel and heating materials, which forces people to use primitive methods for heating. In the same context, the people of the camp launched "SOS" letters to several political and international figures, calling for the need to break the siege of the camp, and restore the normal life inside the camp.

Najib Abdullah, an official of the camp demands committee, said that the messages were sent to each of the Ambassador of the State of Palestine in Damascus, Mahmoud al-Khalidi, the director of the international relief agency, and the envoy of the Secretary-General of the United Nations Stephen Demustura, and Director General of the Palestinian Arab refugees in the Republic of Syria.

On the other hand, violent clashes voices were heard clearly at Al Tiba town in Khan Dannoun Camp in Damascus city, while the residents are living in a state of anticipation in the light of the continued clashes and high intensity over the past few days. It is referred that the camp receives hundreds of Palestinian families who were displaced from the camps because of the siege, bombardment, and clashes.

In a related context, the people of Jermana Camp live similar situations, as violent clashes broke out yesterday, in the vicinity of the camp, causing panic and fear of the arrival of the clashes to their camp, and generally



the camp lives a state of relative calm, with the exception of some clashes that broke out between now and then in neighborhoods.

The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics:

- ***The Yarmouk Camp:*** - *The Continuance of the siege which is imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC for 478 days respectively in addition to the power cut for more than 561 days and the water cut for 48 days respectively. The number of the siege victims is 155 victims.*
- ***Al Husayneyya Camp:*** - *The Regular Army still prevents the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 380 days respectively.*
- ***Al Sbeina Camp:*** - *The Regular Army still prevents the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 349 days respectively.*
- ***Handarat Camp:***-*The residents left the camp since 549 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled the camp.*
- ***Dara'a Camp:*** - *Almost 195 days without water and a complete absence of basic services.*
- ***Khan Al Sheih Camp:*** - *the roads that linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for the Zakia road.*



- ***Khan Danoun Camp:*** - economic crisis is still continue, specially the unemployment and the high prices.
- ***Al Nairab Camp:*** - the power is still cut for more than a year.
- ***Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:*** - relative calm situation in light of the economic crises.
