"Regime Troops Breach Truce Deal after Grabbing Hold of Khan Al-Sheih Camp, Kidnap 3 Residents"



- Overnight clashes flare up in Yarmouk Camp
- Pro-regime "Liwa Al-Quds" battalion forces 3 Palestinian families out of Al-Neirab Camp
- Palestine Charity Commission distributes relief aids to Palestinian families in southern Syria

Latest Developments

A couple of days ago, the Syrian government troops broke into Khan Al-Sheih Camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus western suburbs and kidnapped three residents, identified as Shadi Al-Hindi, Khaled Al-Hindi, and Hamouda Al-Hindi.

The regime troops further stormed a stockroom belonging to the Palestine Charity Commission and seized food items set to be distributed to civilians.



The assault is another chain in the series of violations of the truce deal struck with the opposition outfits. Among the provisos laid down by the deal was the fact that the government troops would not enter into the camp and task the Palestine Liberation Army (PLA) to supervise the shelter.

At noontime on Sunday, a mass abduction sweep was launched by pro-government forces from the Sa'sa' Branch, in Rural Damascus, against



Khan Al-Sheih residents. The list of arrestees included youngsters Faris Eissat, Mohamed Abdullah, and Mohamed Arsan.

The government forces also seized aid-loaded vehicles owned by relief institutions and charities in Khan Al-Sheih.

At predawn time on Sunday, violent clashes between ISIS militias and the opposition outfits rocked Al-Zein and Dowar Filastine neighborhoods in Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees in southern Damascus. No casualties were reported in the fighting.

Those who have remained in Yarmouk Camp have launched cries for help over the abject living condition they have been grappling with due to the tough blockade imposed by the regime troops and their war abettors for over three years.

The situation has gone from bad to worse after ISIS militias rolled into the shelter in early April 2016 and tightened grip on the residents of Fatah Al-Sham-run Ein Al-Ghazal quarter.

Meanwhile, AGPS news reporter said the pro-government Liwa Al-Quds battalion forced three Palestinian families from the Al-Neirab Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Aleppo, in the first such move since the outburst of hostilities in Syria.

The families were reportedly deported from the camp on claims that they had been taking shelter in opposition-led areas.

Recently, Liwa Al-Quds leader Adnan Al-Sayid ordered Palestinian families to retreat from the camp to the eastern Aleppo neighborhood of Jibreen.



Around 500 fighters, out of a total of 3,500 fighters enlisted at the non-Palestinian Liwa Al-Quds Brigade, have been identified as Palestinians who previously sought refuge in such shelter as Al-Neirab, Handarat, and Al-Raml. Fighters from Aleppo city and its northern and western suburbs along with so-called Shabah Al-Aswad combatants have also been fighting alongside the Al-Neirab-headquartered battalion.

At the same time, the Palestinian minor Mustafa Ali Ayoub, born on August 11, 1996, has been held in government penitentiaries for the fourth consecutive year.



Mustafa was kidnapped by the Syrian regime troops from his own family home in Al-Tadhamun neighborhood, near Al-Ne'ma Oven, on May 10, 2012, on charges of taking part in anti-government rallies.

AGPS kept record of the incarceration of 1,137 Palestinians in Syrian government lock-ups, including 75 female refugees. 456 Palestinians were, meanwhile, tortured to death in those very jails.



Civil Action Commissions

As part of its “Warmth of Winter” campaign, the Palestine Charity Commission distributed firewood, food boxes, and heating allowances to nearly 1,500 displaced Palestinian families in the southern Syrian province of Deraa.

Palestinian refugee communities in Deraa have been subjected to dire living conditions due to the frequent water and power cuts.

70% of civilian homes and facilities in Deraa Camp have been knocked down in the raging warfare, forcing hundreds of families to seek refuge in Al-Muzeireeb town and southern Syrian villages.

In a related development, the Palestinian Red Crescent and the Palestine Charity Commission provided over 400 civilians displaced from Yarmouk to the nearby towns of Yalda, Babila, and Beit Sahem, with free medical check-ups and medicines.





The move makes part of the 4th Medical Week Mission that has recently kicked off in the area due to the propagation of life-threatening diseases and infections among the displaced community of Yarmouk.

Yarmouk Camp has been subjected to a tripartite blockade slapped by Fatah Al-Sham Battalions, ISIS militias, and the government outfits.

Palestinians of Syria: December 26, 2016 Statistics:

- *At least 3,414 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,137 Palestinian refugees, including 80 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,286 days in a row.*
- *192 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 990 and 805 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,332 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 69 days.*
- *Government troops ban residents of Al-Sbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,140 days running.*
- *Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
