"The Detained Palestinian Syrian Refugees in Egypt Renew their Appeal to Release them"



- An Old Man Died Due to the Siege on the Yarmouk camp, Raises the Siege Victims' Toll to 173 Victims

Victims

The Palestinian refugee Farouq Mohammed Ibrahim 69 years died due to a heart attack because of the malnutrition and the lack of food and medical care due to the siege that imposed by the Syrian Army and the PFGC groups on the Yarmouk camp since 628 days which raises the siege victims' toll in the Yarmouk camp to 173 victims.

Fadi Al Khatib from the Yarmouk camp was recognized from the leaked pictures for the victims of the torture and forced disappearance in the Syrian prisons. The AGPS received news about the death of Manar Khnim 23 years from Nahr Easha neighborhood in Damascus under torture in the Syrian prisons where activists reported that she was arrested on 12th of October 2012 and the Syrian Security delivered her personal identity card to her family.

Recent Updates

56 detained Palestinian Syrian refugees in the Egyptian Prisons renewed their appeals to the international organizations, human right organizations, concerned organizations, PLO and the Palestinian Embassy in Egypt to move rapidly to release them and to put an end to their tragedy, where they are still detained since December. The Egyptian Authorities detained them after they were exposed to a scam by the smugglers who left them on one of the islands on the Egyptian coast while they were trying to reach Italy launching from the Turkish coasts.

It is mentioned that 16 human rights organizations demanded earlier the Egyptian Authorities to immediately release all the Palestinian Syrian refugees detained in its prisons without any charges. They also called Egypt to apply the international legal convictions and to put an end to the arbitrary refugees' detention.

On the other hand, the Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus witnessed food aids distribution on the Yarmouk camp's residents who are besieged for more than 628 days, where the checkpoints of the Regular Army and the PFGC impose a strict siege on about 20000 citizens inside the camp. It is mentioned that all hospitals are stopped working in the camp except for Palestine hospital that works with its minimum capacity due to the shortage of materials and medical cadres.

In south of Syria, Der'aa camp for Palestinian refugees suffers from a severe water crises where it is cut for about 345 days amid the absence of the basic services such as hospitals, power and telecommunications. It is

mentioned that about 70% of the camp's houses became unlivable due to the violent bombing during the last months, which forced hundreds of families to leave the camp to the surrounding areas fearing on their lives. The residents also complain of the default of the relief organizations and UNRWA in the camp where they don't receive aids, moreover, UNRWA distributes aids in the surrounding towns and the residents are not able to reach those areas fearing from the checkpoints in the roads.

Numbers and Statistics till 25/3/2015

- *At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 628 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 708 days, water was cut for 197 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 173 victims.*
- *80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51,300 in Lebanon and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.*
- *Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 529 days respectively.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 499 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 701 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 345 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
